APPROVAL OF PETITION RLP-5327 AND MAP 19238 TO CHANGE THE LOCATION OF
DIVERSION FOR WATER APPROPRIATION A-3686

WATER DIVISION 2-A

BACKGROUND

1. Records on file in the Department of Natural Resources (Department) show that surface water appropriation A-3686 is held by Mark Scott.
2. Appropriation A-3686 has a priority date of February 15, 1944, and authorizes the use of water for irrigation of 112 acres of land. The water may be diverted from the Cedar River at a point of diversion located in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 26, Township 18 North, Range 7 West of the 6th P.M. in Nance County. Water diverted shall not exceed the ratio of one cubic foot per second (cfs) for every 800 acres irrigated at a maximum rate of 0.14 cfs.
3. On March 10, 2015, Mark Scott filed petition RLP-5327 in the Department for a permit for two additional locations of diversion for appropriation A-3686.
4. On May 12, 2015, Mark Scott filed map number 19238 in the Department showing the location of the additional proposed pump sites and the land to be irrigated under appropriation A-3686 through petition RLP-5327.

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

1. Petition RLP-5327 for a permit to add two locations of diversion for appropriation A-3686 and map number 19238 are APPROVED.
2. Appropriation A-3686 through petition RLP-5327 is now A-3686R.

3. Appropriation A-3686R shall be shown in the Department's records authorizing the use of water to irrigate 112 acres of land described below and depicted on map number 19238, which is made a part of this Order. The water may be diverted from the Cedar River at points of diversion located on the right bank of the stream in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 26, the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 36 and the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 35, all in Township 18 North, Range 7 West of the 6th P.M. in Nance County, as depicted on map number 19238. Water diverted shall not exceed the ratio of one cfs for every 800 acres irrigated at a maximum combined rate of 0.14 cfs (63 gallons per minute) from all points of diversion.

4. Pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. § 46-231, the total volume of water under appropriations A-3686R, A-4058BR, A-8301R, A-15534R, A-15535BR and A-17652 shall not exceed three-acre feet per year for each acre of land for which such appropriation has been made.
5. Appropriation A-3686R is approved for irrigation of the same land as appropriations A-4058BR, A-8301, A-15534, A-15535BR and A-17985R.
6. All terms and conditions of appropriation A-3686 remain in effect unless specifically changed by this Order.
7. The appropriator must comply with all relevant statutes. This includes, but is not limited to, the following:
 - A. Notify the Department of any change in ownership or address.
 - B. Notify the Department of the name and address of the person responsible for the use of the water appropriation (this may include farm managers, tenants, or relatives that actually apply the water to the approved use).
 - C. Obtain approval from the Department prior to taking any action that changes the location of the point of diversion, the location of the place of use, the type of use, or the type of appropriation.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Failure to comply with all laws and regulations pertaining to surface water appropriations, any orders issued by the Director of the Department of Natural Resources, or the provisions of this Approval may cause cancellation of part or all of this appropriation, temporary closing of the appropriation, administrative penalty, criminal prosecution, or any combination thereof.

Nebraska law provides that failure to use an appropriation for more than five consecutive years may result in cancellation of the appropriation.

This appropriation is not a guarantee that water will be available. Nebraska law gives priority to senior appropriations. This appropriation may be closed if there is insufficient water to satisfy senior appropriations.
