APPROVAL OF EXPEDITED TRANSFER EXT-4763 FOR WATER APPROPRIATION D-509

AND MAP NUMBER 18599

WATER DIVISION 2-E

BACKGROUND

1. Records on file in the Department of Natural Resources (Department) show that surface water appropriation D-509 is held by Stewart's Monroe Creek Ranch, LLC.
2. Appropriation D-509 has a priority date of July 2, 1888, and authorizes the use of water for irrigation of the 35.0 acres of land described below. The water may be diverted from Monroe Creek at a point of diversion located in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 27, Township 33 North, Range 56 West of the 6<sup>th</sup> P.M. in Sioux County. Water diverted shall not exceed the ratio of one cubic foot per second (cfs) for every 70 acres irrigated at a maximum rate of 0.50 cfs.

3. On July 11, 2013, Jerald Stewart, Jr. and Jerald E. Stewart, Sr., on behalf of Stewart's Monroe Creek Ranch, LLC, filed application EXT-4763 for a permit for an expedited transfer of the location of use for land authorized to be irrigated by appropriation D-509.
4. On January 15, 2014, Austin Stewart filed map number 18599 showing the land proposed to be irrigated under appropriation D-509 through transfer EXT-4763.

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

1. Application EXT-4763 for a permit for an expedited transfer of the location of use and map number 18599 are APPROVED.

2. Appropriation D-509 through transfer EXT-4763 authorizes the use of water to irrigate 35.0 acres of land described below and depicted on map number 18599, which is made a part of this Order. The water may be diverted from Monroe Creek at a point of diversion located on the left bank of the stream in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 27, Township 33 North, Range 56 West of the 6<sup>th</sup> P.M. in Sioux County, as depicted on map number 18599. Water diverted shall not exceed the ratio of one cfs for every 70 acres irrigated at a maximum rate of 0.50 cfs (224 gallons per minute). The total volume may not exceed 3 acre-feet per irrigated acre per year; not to exceed the least amount of water necessary for the production of crops in the exercise of good husbandry.

3. All terms and conditions of appropriation D-509 remain in effect unless specifically changed by this Order.
4. The appropriator must comply with all relevant statutes. These relevant statutory requirements include, but are not limited to, the following:
- A. Notify the Department of any change in ownership or address.
  - B. Notify the Department of the name and address of the person responsible for the use of the water appropriation (this may include farm managers, tenants, or relatives that actually apply the water to the approved use).
  - C. Obtain approval from the Department prior to taking any action that changes the location of the point of diversion, the location of the place of use, the type of use, or the type of appropriation.

#### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION


Failure to comply with all laws and regulations pertaining to surface water appropriations, any orders issued by the Director of the Department of Natural Resources, or the provisions of this Approval may cause cancellation of part or all of this appropriation, temporary closing of the appropriation, administrative penalty, criminal prosecution, or any combination thereof.

Nebraska law provides that failure to use an appropriation for more than five consecutive years may result in cancellation of the appropriation.

This appropriation is not a guarantee that water will be available. Nebraska law gives priority to senior appropriations. This appropriation may be closed if there is insufficient water to satisfy senior appropriations.
