ORDER DIVIDING AND CHANGING OWNERSHIP OF APPROPRIATION A-1845

WATER DIVISION 2-A

Background

1. Records on file in the Department of Natural Resources (Department) show that surface water appropriation A-1845 is currently held by Carol Swartz and Myron C. McGraw.
2. Appropriation A-1845 has a priority date of August 26, 1926, and authorizes the use of water for irrigation of the 46 acres of land described below. The water may be diverted from Victoria Creek at a point of diversion located on the right bank of the stream in the SW¼NW¼ of Section 6, Township 19 North, Range 20 West of the 6th P.M. in Custer County. The rate that water may be diverted shall not exceed one cubic foot per second (cfs) for every 70 acres irrigated at a maximum rate of 0.66 cfs. Total annual volume of water diverted may not exceed 3 acre-feet per acre irrigated.

3. Joe E. and Debra J. Grantzinger filed a Notice of Change of Ownership indicating that they are the owners of a portion of the land authorized to be irrigated by appropriation A-1845.

Order

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

1. Appropriation A-1845 is divided into two appropriations, A-1845A and A-1845B.

2. Appropriation A-1845A is held by Joe E. and Debra J. Grantzinger.

A. They are allowed to divert 0.20 cfs (90 gallons per minute) from Victoria Creek to irrigate the 14 acres of land described below and as depicted on map number 17417 which is hereby made a part of this Order. The total rate that water may be diverted shall not exceed one cfs per 70 acres irrigated. Total annual volume of water diverted may not exceed 3 acre-feet per acre irrigated.

B. All terms and conditions of appropriation A-1845 remain in effect unless specifically changed by this Order.

C. The point of diversion remains on the right bank of Victoria Creek in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 6, Township 19 North, Range 20 West of the 6th P.M. in Custer County. If the owners of appropriation A-1845A do not have access to this point of diversion, they must either obtain permission from the landowner or apply for a new point of diversion. This Order does not authorize access to the existing point of diversion.

3. Appropriation A-1845B is held by Carol Swartz.

A. She is allowed to divert 0.46 cfs (206 gallons per minute) from Victoria Creek to irrigate the 32.0 acres of land described below and as depicted on map number 17418 which is hereby made a part of this Order. The total rate that water may be diverted shall not exceed one cfs per 70 acres irrigated. Total annual volume of water diverted may not exceed 3 acre-feet per acre irrigated.

If the owner of appropriation A-1845B does not have access to this point of diversion, she must either obtain permission from the landowner or apply for a new point of diversion. This Order does not authorize access to the existing point of diversion.
