- 1. Welcome and Open Meetings Act:** Miller noted that a copy of the Open Meetings Act was available in the meeting room.
- 2. Publication of Meeting Notices:** The NDNR published a public notice (Attachment B) of the PBC meeting in the Grand Island Independent on February 15, 2016, the North Platte Telegraph on February 13, 2016, and the Scottsbluff Star Herald on February 23, 2016.
- 3. Agenda Modifications:** No revisions were made to the agenda (Attachment C).
- 4. Approval of the December 7th 2015, PBC Meeting Minutes:**
Motion: To approve the December 7th, 2015, PBC meeting minutes (Attachment D).
Vogt motioned to approve and Schellpeper seconded. Motion passed with all ayes
- 5. Budget Update (NDNR):**

A. Operations: Sharp reported that a liability insurance renewal invoice was received. (Attachment E).

Motion: To approve payment of the liability insurance invoice in the amount of \$3,470.00 to be equally split by the six entities in the amount of \$578.33. The South Platte NRD will send the invoices to the NRDs and NDNR.

Thorburn motioned to approve and Vogt seconded. Motion passed with all ayes.

B. Studies: Sharp reported the fourth invoice (Attachment F) from The Flatwater Group was received on the Conservation Measures Study, Phase II, in the amount of \$10,730.00. The amount would be split 50/50 with DNR paying 50% (\$5,365.00) and the NRDs splitting the other 50% equally (\$1073.00 x 5).

i. Conservation Measures Study (Attachment G):

a. **Invoice:** The invoice needs approval and then NDNR will send the invoices to the NRDs.

Motion: To approve the Flatwater Invoice on Contract #571 in the amount of \$10,730.00. **Schellpeper motioned to approve and Vogt seconded. Motion passed with all ayes.**

Action: Invoices will be sent to the individual NRDs.

b. **Conservation Measures Study Contract Extension:** To extend the contract with Flatwater through December 2016 with no additional cost.

Motion: To approve the extension of the Flatwater contract. **Vogt motioned to approve and Schellpeper seconded. Motion passed with all ayes.**

ii. Difference Between Current and Fully Appropriated Study: It was discussed to amend the contract with HDR to extend through June 30, 2016, with no cost added.

Motion: To approve extension of the HDR contract. **Thorburn motioned to approve and Horn seconded. Motion passed with all ayes.**

iii. Robust Review: No update

C. Second three-year increment funding (years 4-6)

i. Invoices

a. **E-65/Elwood (TBNRD):** An invoice in the amount of \$96,252.00 was received. This amount was split with monies from the 1-3

Year Budget with the remaining coming from the 4-6 Years Budget. The contract has ended with funds remaining.

Motion: To approve carry-over of the remaining budget to the next fiscal year. **Thorburn motioned to approve and Shellpeper seconded. Motion passed with all ayes.**

- b. **Phelps Canal:** Sharp reported an invoice was received. Acre-feet and funds remain. CPNRD requested all their budget be spent on Orchard-Alfalfa. An invoice was sent out to NDNR.
- c. **North Dry Creek:** Sharp reported a final invoice was paid leaving funds that were transferred to the E-65/Elwood project in the amount of \$11,047.70. This will help toward paying off the grant with NET.

Motion: To transfer TBNRD remaining funds to Elwood and E-65 Excess Flows. **Thorburn motioned to approve and Vogt seconded. Motion passed with all ayes.**

6. Project Updates

A. N-CORPE (TBNRD): Miller reported that the current estimated timeline for construction of the north pipeline is late 2016.

B. J-2 Regulating Reservoir (NDNR): Schellpeper reported that she and the Nebraska Community Foundation are working on paying the third invoice. Due to some discrepancy in the numbers the payment has been delayed. Once paid, invoices will be sent to the NRDs. There is no technical update at this time, but the quarterly progress report will be out in the next week. Kevin Boyd of CNPPID did give some feedback on the project.

Action: NDNR will send out invoices to the NRDs.

C. North Platte NRD Lease and Retirements (NPNRD):

- i. **Cow Camp:** A short-term solution is being looked into for the balance of the lease to utilize the well on the property to augment streamflow to ensure that winter-time streamflows are met. There have been several technical conversations with NDNR in this regard. A revised permit application will be filed with the new plan in place.

D. Tri-Basin Phase II Augmentation (TBNRD): The final invoice has been submitted and the project is ready for use.

E. South Platte NRD Industrial Baseline Offset (SPNRD): Horn reported that water use continues to be monitored.

F. Excess Flow Diversion Updates (NDNR, TPNRD, & TBNRD) (Attachment H):

i. NPPD Letter on Platte River Groundwater Recharge (Attachment I): Schellpeper reported the NPPD letter was sent to everyone for review. Jessie Winter attended the latest WAC meeting and learned that the Wyoming reservoirs on the North Platte River are nearly at or above normal storage volumes so there may be opportunity for excess flows this spring.

7. Project Request

A. South Platte NRD Oliver Reservoir Streamflow Enhancement Project (Attachment J): A contract has been drafted for SPNRD’s review. There are no work plans at this time, but Olsson Associates will be assisting with the project. Horn gave another brief overview of the project.

8. Public Comments: There were no public comments.

9. Adjourn: Miller adjourned the meeting at 2:50 p.m. and **an emergency meeting of the PBC was called.**

- 1. Welcome and Open Meetings Act:** Miller noted that a copy of the Open Meetings Act was available in the meeting room.
- 2. Publication of Meeting Notices:** The NDNR published a public notice (Attachment B) of the PBC meeting in the Grand Island Independent on November 30, 2015, the North Platte Telegraph on December 5, 2015, and the Scottsbluff Star Herald on November 28, 2015.
- 3. Agenda Modifications:** No revisions were made to the agenda (Attachment C).
- 4. Approval of the October 6th, 2015, PBC Meeting Minutes:**

Motion: To approve the October 6th, 2015, PBC meeting minutes (Attachment D).
Berge motioned to approve and Vogt seconded. Motion passed with all ayes.
- 5. Budget Update (NDNR)**
 - A. Operations:** Schellpeper reported there were no updates at this time. (Attachment E).

B. Studies: Schellpeper stated The Flatwater Group invoice for the Conservation Measures Study, Phase II, in the amount of \$20,471.25 would need a motion. The amount would be split 50/50 with DNR paying 50% (\$10,235.63) and the NRDs splitting the other 50% equally (\$2,047.13 x 5).

i. Conservation Measures Study

a. Invoice: The final amount of the invoice (Attachment F) needs to be approved and then NDNR will send the invoices to the NRDs.

Motion: To approve the Flatwater Invoice on Contract #571 in the amount of \$20,471.25.

Thorburn motioned to approve and Horn seconded. Motion passed with all ayes.

Action: Invoices will be sent to the individual NRDs.

ii. Difference Between Current and Fully Appropriated Study: No update

iii. Robust Review: No update

C. Second three-year increment funding (years 4-6)

Schellpeper reported in the years 1-3 on Phase II North Dry Creek there is a remaining balance of \$17,160.36. Thorburn has put together an estimate for the final budget on this project. Thorburn reported that he would be asking NDNR for approximately \$6,700 to finalize the North Dry Creek Project. After the final bills are paid TBNRD would like to transfer the remaining dollar amount in the North Dry Creek project to the Elwood Reservoir and E-65 Excess Flow Project.

Motion: To transfer TBNRD unspent monies to Elwood and E-65 Excess Flows.
Thorburn motioned to approve and Vogt seconded. Motion passed with all ayes.

Schellpeper reported that the Grandview Permanent Retirement project has been paid out and is completed. Payment was made in the Fall/Winter 2015 to E65 Canal and Elwood Recharge Project with some dollars remaining.

Requests for Funds for E65 Canal & Elwood Reservoir and Phelps Canal Projects Memo (Attachment G) was presented to the members and Shellpeper gave an explanation of the contracts.

Motion: To approve funding for E65 Canal & Elwood Reservoir, Contract #571, in the amount of \$242,980.

Berge motioned to approve and Vogt seconded. Motion passed with all ayes.

Ann Dimmit, TPNRD, explained the memo (Attachment H) in regard to a funding request for the TPNRD and SPNRD Excess Flow Recharge Project.

Motion: To approve funding for TPNRD and SPNRD Excess Flow Recharge Project, Contract #587. This funding is not to include WRCF matching dollars for TPNRD as TPNRD no longer has matching dollars available from the WRCF.

Vogt motioned to approve and Thorburn seconded. Motion passed with all ayes.

Mark Czaplewski, CPNRD, gave an explanation of his memo discussing the existing budget for use on the Orchard-Alfalfa Canal Rehabilitation Project (Attachment I).

Motion: To approve the already budgeted funds of \$292,724.48 to cover expenditures of the Orchard-Alfalfa Canal Rehabilitation Project, Contract #615.

Horn motioned to approve and Thorburn seconded. Motion passed with all ayes.

Action: CPNRD will work with NDNR to amend contract #615.

6. Project Updates

A. N-CORPE: Miller reported that the current estimated timeline for construction of the north pipeline is late 2016. The south pipeline is currently operating at half capacity to deliver 32,000 a-f to the Republican River, based on accounting. TPNRD continues to have 25% of their share of water in storage due to the lack of the north pipeline. Shaw, with the help of Jim Schneider, will be working on a model acceptable to the N-CORPE body to maintain sustainability in the aquifer.

B. J-2 Regulating Reservoir: Schellpeper reminded the group of the previous discussion on the J-2 budget (Attachment J). Miller added information from the Governance Committee meeting that discussions were had on the much higher cost of the J-2 Project. New options are being looked into.

C. North Platte NRD Lease and Retirements (NPNRD)

- i. Cow Camp:** A contract with NDNR for reimbursement on lease payments has been drafted. NPNRD is looking into different ideas for the project as the site is not conducive to a recharge pit.
- ii. Grandview:** This is completed.
- iii. Hardt & Tighe:** Contracts are being drawn to facilitate reimbursement.

D. Tri-Basin Phase II Augmentation: Thorburn had nothing new to report.

E. South Platte NRD Industrial Baseline Offset (SPNRD): Horn reported that water use continues to be monitored. The second annual payment will be made this month and SPNRD will be requesting reimbursement from the PBC.

F. Excess Flow Diversion Updates (NDNR, TPNRD, & TBNRD): Most of the canals used for excess flow diversions will not operate over the winter months due to concerns about damage from icy conditions. One exception would be the diversions into the CNPPID system for E-65 and Elwood Reservoir.

7. Project Request

A. South Platte NRD Oliver Reservoir Streamflow Enhancement Project: Horn gave an explanation of his memo and project report (Attachment K) to request approval for reimbursement in the amount of \$277,200. After approval there would be a more detailed SOW completed. Schellpeper asked for an estimate on the streamflow increase and also wanted to check into the standard for monies allowed for project studies. It was decided that more information would be provided by SPNRD.

Motion: To provisionally approve the Oliver Reservoir Streamflow Enhancement Project in the amount of \$277,200, engineering and analysis at \$162,000; with the condition that SPNRD provide additional information on the benefits of the project to streamflow and NDNR reviews applicable funding procedures.

Vogt motioned to approve the request and Thorburn seconded. Motion passed with all ayes.

Action: 1) SPNRD will provide the hydrology and hydrogeology study and more information on the estimated benefit to streamflow.
2) NDNR will review the additional information provided by SPNRD as well as the funding procedures.

8. Public Comments: There were no public comments.

9. Adjourn: Miller adjourned the meeting at 3:15 p.m.



Dear Jennifer:

At the December 7, 2015, meeting of the Platte Basin Coalition, the proposal for the Oliver Reservoir Streamflow Enhancement Project (Project) was approved for the full funding level of \$277,200. However, the approval was contingent on the South Platte Natural Resources District (SPNRD) providing a more concrete estimate of the expected benefits to streamflow in Lodgepole Creek as a result of the Project. This letter is intended to provide that information.

As stated in the Project proposal, the Oliver Reservoir Hydrology and Hydrogeology Study (Olsson Associates, 2003) determined that seepage from the reservoir accounted for approximately 50% of the outflows, with the other 50% split fairly evenly between evaporation and overflow/allowed spills. For this analysis a conservative assumption was made that no water provided to the reservoir as part of the Project will be directly spilled to the Creek. Therefore, approximately two thirds of the water provided to the reservoir from the Project will seep from the reservoir and enhance streamflow below the reservoir.

At this point, the amount of water that the project will provide to the reservoir on an annual basis has not been determined, and will depend on several factors, including the desired pool elevation to be achieved and the availability of groundwater. The desired pool elevation will be determined through the planned public participation process and will likely be based on the initial pool elevation in a given year as well. The availability of groundwater will depend on several factors including the public perception of drilling a new well for the Project and the interest from irrigators in leasing allocations to the SPNRD for the Project.

For the purpose of providing an estimated benefit to the streamflows in Lodgepole Creek below the reservoir, conservative assumptions were made so that a *minimum* benefit can be provided. If the

Project results in the drilling of one new well that is capable of delivering 1000 gallons per minute to the reservoir, and the window for delivery is March through June of any given year for a delivery period of 120 days, the project will deliver approximately 530 acre-feet per year to the reservoir. The result will be an increase in streamflow below the reservoir of approximately 350 acre-feet per year. If the new well is drilled in a location with a 50-year stream depletion factor of 50%, the net result will be an increase in streamflow of approximately 175 acre-feet per year.

If the project expends the entire approved budget of \$462,000 (including the NRDs 40% cost share), the cost of this permanent streamflow enhancement will be approximately \$2,500 per acre-foot given the above conservative assumptions. The cost per acre-foot may be reduced significantly if the water comes from the purchase or lease of existing irrigation allocations, if the project delivers more water on average than assumed here, or if a portion of the water provided to the reservoir ends up being directly spilled to the Creek in some years. Even considering the high-end cost of \$2,500 per acre-foot, the cost of the Project is well in line with the cost of increasing streamflow from other projects in the Platte River Basin.

An additional and significant benefit of the Project is providing to the storage appropriation for the reservoir that depends on streamflow in Lodgepole Creek. Our integrated management plan has the stated goal of eventually returning to a fully appropriated condition in Lodgepole Creek and the SPNRD feels that the benefits provided to the reservoir storage appropriation as a result of the project will be a big step towards getting the Lodgepole Creek back to a fully appropriated status. The benefit of the increased inflows into Oliver Reservoir, using the Project assumptions above, will come at a modest cost of approximately \$850 per acre-foot of project capacity, or if projected out at a 50-year life of the project, only \$20 per acre-foot of water delivered to the reservoir. When considered in the context of the benefits a healthy reservoir brings to the resident of the SPNRD, we feel this cost is a bargain.

I hope this letter provides the information that you need to move forward with a contract between the Department and the SPNRD for this project. Please let me know if you need more information or if we are ready now to move forward.
