APPROVAL OF MAP 18965 FOR WATER APPROPRIATION A-19261

WATER DIVISION 2-F

BACKGROUND

1. On June 3, 2014, Stephen M. Marsh and Thomas C. Marsh filed in the Department of Natural Resources (Department) application A-19261 for a Permit to Appropriate Water.
2. On August 4, 2014, Thomas C. Marsh filed in the Department map number 18965 showing land proposed to be irrigated under application A-19261.

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

1. Map number 18965 is APPROVED.
2. The following land is authorized to be irrigated (appurtenant land) under surface water appropriation A-19261 as depicted on map number 18965 which is made a part of this Order.



3. Appropriation A-19261 has a priority date of June 3, 2014, and authorizes the appropriator the use of water for irrigation of the 122.0 acres of land described above. The water may be diverted from Bow Creek at a point of diversion located on the left bank of the stream in the NW¹/₄NW¹/₄ of Section 17, Township 30 North, Range 1 East of the 6th P.M. in Cedar County, as depicted on map number 18965. Water diverted shall not exceed the ratio of one cubic foot per second (cfs) for every 70 acres irrigated at a maximum rate of 1.74 cfs (781 gallons per minute).

4. Water diverted shall not exceed the ratio of one cfs for every 70 acres irrigated nor the least amount of water necessary for the production of crops in the exercise of good husbandry. Therefore, in any year when less than the maximum permitted acres are being irrigated, the quantity of water diverted at any time may be restricted to 1/70 cfs for each permitted acre being irrigated that year. This appropriation of water under any circumstance shall be limited annually to 3 acre-feet per acre of land on which water is actually and beneficially applied; not to exceed the least amount of water necessary for the production of crops in the exercise of good husbandry.
5. The appropriator is bound by all terms and conditions of the approval of application A-19261.

Box 94676, Lincoln, Nebraska 68509-4676) within 30 days of the date of the order and be accompanied by a filing fee of \$10.
