ORDER GRANTING PETITION VAR-4653 FOR LEAVE TO FILE OR CONSIDER
AN APPLICATION FOR A NEW SURFACE WATER APPROPRIATION WITHIN
A MORATORIUM OR STAY AREA

WATER DIVISION 1-B

BACKGROUND

1. On July 14, 2004, the Department of Natural Resources (Department) issued an Order declaring a formal moratorium in the Republican River Basin on the issuance of all new surface water appropriations.
2. On April 18, 2013, Mary Kay Lyon (Petitioner) filed petition VAR-4653 in the Department for Leave to File or Consider an Application for a New Surface Water Appropriation within a Moratorium Area (Petition). The draft application and documentation attached to the petition is for a permit to impound approximately 31.1 acre-feet of water from the East Branch of Turkey Creek in the existing Smithfield Pasture Reservoir located in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 31, Township 7 North, Range 21 West of the 6th P.M. in Gosper County for the purpose of providing water for livestock and erosion control.
3. A topographical map based upon photogrammetric methods from aerial photographs taken in 1968 of Section 31, Township 7 North, Range 21 West of the 6th P.M. in Gosper County, was filed with petition VAR-4653 and shows that the Smithfield Pasture Reservoir was constructed and impounding water at that time.
4. *Nebraska Revised Statutes* § 46-714(3)(n) allows for new surface water appropriations if the Department grants leave to file an application and subsequently approves a permit for such use.
5. When filing such a petition, a project proponent must offer a clearly stated basis for such request and must offer sufficient good cause shown. *Department of Natural Resources Rules for Surface Water, Title 457 Neb. Admin. Code Chapter 23* lists six circumstances that may be put forward as justification for granting a petition to apply for a permit to impound water, in conjunction with an examination of good cause shown.

CONCLUSIONS:

1. Petitioner has shown good cause in that the impoundment has been providing the benefits of providing water for livestock and erosion control for many years.
2. Smithfield Pasture Reservoir existed prior to the formal moratorium.

3. Therefore, petition VAR-4653 should be granted and Petitioner should be allowed to file an application for a permit to impound water.


ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

1. Petition VAR-4653 meets the requirement of *Department of Natural Resources Rules of Surface Water, Title 457 Neb. Admin. Code Chapter 23, § 001.04*, and is GRANTED.
2. This Order granting leave to file or consider an application for a new surface water appropriation within a moratorium or stay area pursuant to petition VAR-4653 shall be in effect for one year from the date this order is signed.
3. This decision shall not bind the Director to approve any application to which it relates, or in any way be used as evidence of prejudice for the Director's future decisions concerning the specific approval requirements of such an application.
