APPROVAL OF APPLICATION A-17942

WATER DIVISION 2-B

BACKGROUND

1. On December 27, 2000, James Pofahl, on behalf of the Rose Pofahl Estate, filed in the Department of Natural Resources (Department) application A-17942 for a permit to appropriate water and map number 15934 showing land proposed to be irrigated under application A-17942.
2. On May 10, 2001, a Deed of Distribution by Personal Representative was filed in the County Court of Madison, Nebraska. The land appurtenant to appropriation A-17941 located in Rose's Fifth Addition, in the east half of Section 2, Township 23 North, Range 1 West of the 6th P.M. in Madison County was conveyed, assigned and transferred to Louis Pofahl, Pamela Nelson, Paula Olvany, James Pofahl, Robert Pofahl, Debra Wentling, Maxine Reeker and Michael Pofahl, equally, as tenants in common to share and share alike.
3. On February 27, 2002, Ronald J. Albin, Court Appointed Referee, filed in the County Court of Madison, Nebraska, Referee's Deed granted, sold and conveyed the land appurtenant to appropriation A-17941 located in Rose's Fifth Addition of said legal description to Pofahl Farms, Inc.
4. Construction has been completed.

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that application A-17942 is APPROVED subject to the following limitations and conditions:

1. The source of water is Pofahl Oxbow Lake, constructed under storage appropriation A-17941.
2. The water shall be used for the purpose of irrigation.
3. The priority date is December 27, 2000.
4. Only the land shown on map number 15934 may be irrigated under appropriation A-17942.
5. This appropriation will be limited to the land irrigated and the amount of water beneficially used on an annual basis. Such amount shall not exceed 39.3 acre-feet per annum.

6. A measuring device approved by the Department is required.
7. The appropriator must comply with all relevant statutes. The statutes include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - A. Notify the Department of any change in ownership or address.
 - B. Notify the Department of the name and address of the person responsible for the use of the water appropriation (this may include farm managers, tenants, or relatives that actually apply the water to the approved use).
 - C. Obtain approval from the Department prior to taking any action that changes the location of the point of diversion, the location of the place of use, the type of use, or the type of appropriation.
8. The appropriator must comply with the following deadlines:
 - A. The appropriation is not considered perfected until water has been beneficially applied for the purpose stated in this approval. The water appropriated under A-17942 must be beneficially used by September 1, 2017.
 - B. After September 1, 2017, a field investigation will be conducted to determine the acres irrigated, after which an order of cancellation will be issued for any unused portions of appropriation A-17942.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Failure to comply with all laws and regulations pertaining to surface water appropriations, any orders issued by the Director of the Department of Natural Resources, or the provisions of this Approval may result in the cancellation of the appropriation, temporary closing of the appropriation, administrative penalty, criminal prosecution, or any combination thereof.

Nebraska law provides that failure to use a portion or all of a perfected appropriation for more than five consecutive years may result in cancellation of the appropriation.
