ORDER GRANTING PETITION VAR-3579 FOR LEAVE TO FILE OR CONSIDER

AN APPLICATION FOR A NEW SURFACE WATER APPROPRIATION WITHIN

A MORATORIUM OR STAY AREA

WATER DIVISION 1-B

BACKGROUND

1. On July 14, 2004, the Department of Natural Resources (Department) issued an Order declaring a formal moratorium in the Republican River Basin on the issuance of all new surface water appropriations.
2. On February 14, 2013, Richard R. Endacott, on behalf of the Nebraska Board of Educational Lands and Funds (Petitioner), filed petition VAR-3579 in the Department for Leave to File or Consider an Application for a New Surface Water Appropriation within a Moratorium Area (Petition). The draft application and documentation attached to the petition is for a permit to impound approximately 52 acre-feet of water from a tributary to Blackwood Creek in the existing 1948 Cook Dam located in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 36, Township 5 North, Range 32 West of the 6<sup>th</sup> P.M. in Hayes County for the purpose of water for livestock.
3. Department records of aerial photography dating back to 1993 for this location show this dam and reservoir in existence and impounding water.
4. *Nebraska Revised Statutes* § 46-714(3)(n) allows for new surface water appropriations if the Department grants leave to file an application and subsequently approves a permit for such use.
5. When filing such a petition, a project proponent must offer a clearly stated basis for such request and must offer sufficient good cause shown. *Department of Natural Resources Rules for Surface Water, Title 457 Neb. Admin. Code Chapter 23* lists six circumstances that may be put forward as justification for granting a petition to apply for a permit to impound water, in conjunction with an examination of good cause shown.

CONCLUSIONS

1. Petitioner has shown good cause in that the impoundment has been providing the benefits of water for livestock for many years.
2. The 1948 Cook Dam existed prior to the formal moratorium.
3. Therefore, petition VAR-3579 should be granted and the Petitioner should be allowed to file an application for a permit to impound water.


ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

1. Petition VAR-3579 meets the requirement of *Department of Natural Resources Rules of Surface Water, Title 457 Neb. Admin. Code Chapter 23, § 001.04*, and is GRANTED.
2. This Order granting leave to file or consider an application for a new surface water appropriation within a moratorium or stay area pursuant to petition VAR-3579 shall be in effect for two years from the date this order is signed.
3. This decision shall not bind the Director to approve any application to which it relates, or in any way be used as evidence of prejudice for the Director's future decisions concerning the specific approval requirements of such an application.
