APPROVAL OF APPLICATION A-18548 AND MAP NUMBER 19616

WATER DIVISION 2-A

BACKGROUND

1. On October 23, 2007, Marilyn Rhoades filed in the Department of Natural Resources (Department) application A-18548 for a Permit to Appropriate Water.
2. On October 17, 2016, Marilyn Rhoades filed in the Department map number 19616 showing land proposed to be irrigated under application A-18548.

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that application A-18548 and map number 19616 are APPROVED subject to the following limitations and conditions:

1. The following land is authorized to be irrigated (appurtenant land) under surface water appropriation A-18548 as depicted on map number 19616 which is made a part of this Order.

2. Appropriation A-18548 has a priority date of October 23, 2007, and authorizes the appropriator the use of 1.83 cubic feet per second (cfs) (821 gallons per minute) of water for irrigation of the 128.4 acres of land described above. The water may be diverted from the North Loup River at a point of diversion in the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 09, Township 23 North, Range 23 West of the 6th P.M. in Blaine County, as depicted on map number 19616.
3. The rate that water may be diverted shall not exceed one cfs for every 70 acres irrigated nor the least amount of water necessary for the production of crops in the exercise of good husbandry. Therefore, in any year when less than the maximum permitted acres are being irrigated, the quantity of water diverted at any time may be restricted to 1/70 cfs for each permitted acre being irrigated that year. This appropriation of water under any circumstance shall be limited annually to three acre-feet per acre of land on which water is actually and beneficially applied.

4. Only the land shown on map number 19616 may be irrigated under appropriation A-18548.
5. A measuring device, approved by the Department, may be required if so ordered by the Department.
6. The appropriator must comply with all relevant statutes. The statutes include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - A. Notify the Department of any change in ownership or address.
 - B. Notify the Department of the name and address of the person responsible for the use of the water appropriation (this may include farm managers, tenants, or relatives that actually apply the water to the approved use).
 - C. Obtain approval from the Department prior to taking any action that changes the location of the point of diversion, the location of the place of use, the type of use, or the type of appropriation.
7. The appropriator must comply with the following deadlines:
 - A. Construction of the diversion works must begin within twelve months of the signing date of this application approval. The appropriator must proceed diligently with the construction unless interrupted by some unavoidable and natural cause.
 - B. Construction of the project must be completed by two years past the signing date of this application approval.
 - C. The appropriation is not considered perfected until water has been beneficially applied for the purpose stated in this approval. The water appropriated under A-18548 must be beneficially used by September 1, 2019.
 - D. After September 1, 2019, a field investigation will be conducted to determine the acres irrigated, after which an order of cancellation will be issued for any unused portions of appropriation A-18548.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION


Failure to comply with all laws and regulations pertaining to surface water appropriations, any orders issued by the Director of the Department of Natural Resources, or the provisions of this Approval may result in the cancellation of the appropriation, temporary closing of the appropriation, administrative penalty, criminal prosecution, or any combination thereof.

Nebraska law provides that failure to use a portion or all of a perfected appropriation for more than five consecutive years may result in cancellation of the appropriation.

This appropriation is not a guarantee that water will be available. Nebraska law gives priority to senior appropriations. This appropriation may be closed if there is insufficient water to satisfy senior appropriations. If in the future you are not able to divert sufficient amounts of water, and if there are junior appropriations upstream, you may call for water by contacting your local field office.

Box 94676, Lincoln, Nebraska 68509-4676) within 30 days of the date of the order and be accompanied by a filing fee of \$10.
