APPROVAL OF EXPEDITED TRANSFER EXT-5586 FOR WATER APPROPRIATION A-14579B

AND MAP NUMBER 19481

WATER DIVISION 2-C

BACKGROUND

1. Records on file in the Department of Natural Resources (Department) show that surface water appropriation A-14579B is held by Rick P. and Melissa R. Weber.
2. The Order dividing appropriation A-14579 into A-14579A, A-14579B, and A-14579C and approving applications T-779 and T-780 to transfer the location of use for portions of water under appropriation A-14579 assigned two points of diversion to A-14579B: one in **Lot 4 of Section 30**, the other in **Lot 4 of Section 29**, both in Township 33, Range 28 West of the 6th P.M. in Cherry County. However, the appropriator has indicated that the only active location of diversion for A-14579B is in **Lot 4 of Section 29**, of said legal description.
3. Appropriation A-14579B has a priority date of December 7, 1976, and authorizes the use of water for irrigation of the 10.0 acres of land described below. The water may be diverted from the Niobrara River at a point of diversion located in Lot 4 of Section 29, Township 33 North, Range 28 West of the 6th P.M. in Cherry County. Water diverted shall not exceed the ratio of one cubic foot per second (cfs) for every 70 acres irrigated at a maximum rate of 0.14 cfs.

4. On March 10, 2015, Rick P. and Melissa R. Weber filed application EXT-5586 for a permit for an expedited transfer of the location of use for land authorized to be irrigated by appropriation A-14579B and map number 19481 showing the land proposed to be irrigated under appropriation A-14579B through transfer EXT-5586.
5. Map number 19481 was prepared, using current mapping technology, showing the Department's forty acre government subdivisions. Therefore, the point of diversion is now located in the NW¹/₄SW¹/₄ of Section 29, Township 33 North, Range 28 West of the 6th P.M. in Cherry County and the location of irrigated land has been updated to reflect the Department's forty acre government subdivisions.

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

1. Application EXT-5586 for a permit for an expedited transfer of the location of use and map number 19481 are APPROVED.
2. Appropriation A-14579B through transfer EXT-5586 authorizes the use of water to irrigate 10.0 acres of land described below and depicted on map number 19481, which is made a part of this Order. The water may be diverted from the Niobrara River at a point of diversion located on the left bank of the stream in the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 29, Township 33 North, Range 28 West of the 6th P.M. in Cherry County, as depicted on map number 19481. Water diverted shall not exceed the ratio of one cfs for every 70 acres irrigated at a maximum rate of 0.14 cfs (63 gallons per minute). The total volume may not exceed 3 acre-feet per irrigated acre per year; not to exceed the least amount of water necessary for the production of crops in the exercise of good husbandry.

3. All terms and conditions of appropriation A-14579 and A-14579B remain in effect unless specifically changed by this Order.
4. The appropriator must comply with all relevant statutes. These relevant statutory requirements include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - A. Notify the Department of any change in ownership or address.
 - B. Notify the Department of the name and address of the person responsible for the use of the water appropriation (this may include farm managers, tenants, or relatives that actually apply the water to the approved use).
 - C. Obtain approval from the Department prior to taking any action that changes the location of the point of diversion, the location of the place of use, the type of use, or the type of appropriation.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Failure to comply with all laws and regulations pertaining to surface water appropriations, any orders issued by the Director of the Department of Natural Resources, or the provisions of this Approval may cause cancellation of part or all of this appropriation, temporary closing of the appropriation, administrative penalty, criminal prosecution, or any combination thereof.

Nebraska law provides that failure to use an appropriation for more than five consecutive years may result in cancellation of the appropriation.

This appropriation is not a guarantee that water will be available. Nebraska law gives priority to senior appropriations. This appropriation may be closed if there is insufficient water to satisfy senior appropriations.
