

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

1. Part of appropriation A-15182 at the rate of 1.7 cfs for use upon 119.0 acres of land located in parts of Section 30, Township 34 North, Range 14 West, and parts of Section 25, Township 34 North, Range 15 West of the 6th P.M. in Boyd County is CANCELLED.
2. The Department's mapping staff, using current mapping technology, prepared map number 18088 which more accurately depicts the 88.7 acres of land authorized for irrigation under appropriation A-15180. The total acres under irrigation remain unchanged; however, the numbers of acres per quarter-quarter are more precise.
3. Appropriation A-15182 now authorizes the appropriator to divert water from the Niobrara River to irrigate the 88.7 acres of land described below and depicted on map number 18088 which is made a part of this Order. The points of diversion remain in the NE¹/₄SW¹/₄ and the SE¹/₄SW¹/₄ of Section 30, Township 34 North, Range 14 West of the 6th P.M. in Boyd County. Water diverted shall not exceed the ratio of one cfs for every 70 acres irrigated at a maximum combined rate of 1.27 cfs (570 gallons per minute) from all points of diversion.

4. All terms and conditions of appropriation A-15182 remain in effect unless specifically changed by this Order.
5. The appropriator must comply with all relevant statutes. This includes, but is not limited to, the following:
 - A. Notify the Department of any change in ownership or address.
 - B. Notify the Department of the name and address of the person responsible for the use of the water appropriation (this may include farm managers, tenants, or relatives that actually apply the water to the approved use).
 - C. Obtain approval from the Department prior to taking any action that changes the location of the point of diversion, the location of the place of use, the type of use, or the type of appropriation.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION


Failure to comply with all laws and regulations pertaining to surface water appropriations and any orders issued by the Director of the Department of Natural Resources may result in the cancellation of the appropriation, temporary closing of the appropriation, administrative penalty, criminal prosecution, or any combination thereof.

Nebraska law provides that failure to use a portion or all of a perfected appropriation for more than five consecutive years may result in cancellation of the appropriation.

This appropriation is not a guarantee that water will be available. Nebraska law gives priority to senior appropriations. This appropriation may be closed if there is insufficient water to satisfy senior appropriations. If you are not able to divert sufficient amounts of water, you may call for water by contacting your local field office.
