


Wetlands Team Overview 0 0 0 0

- Continue to receive field support from Resource Soil Scientists as well.








- Why protect species?

Reasons for Decline:

- Habitat Loss/Fragmentation
- Pesticides/Insecticides
- Water quality
- Instream Flow Depletion
- Hunting/Trapping/Collecting

Nongame & Endangered Species Conservation Act

- NESCA is like Endangered Species Act (ESA)
- All federally listed species are state listed...but not vice versa
- Prohibits "take"
 - harass, harm, etc...
 - applies to everyone
- Currently 31 state-listed species in Nebraska

NESCA Consultation Requirement

State permitted/funded actions must consult with NGPC to ensure they will not jeopardize the continued existence of threatened and endangered species or result in destruction of critical habitat for such species

<u>Neb. Rev. Stat.</u> § 37-807 (3)

NESCA Consultation

Consultation Process:

- Work with projects to develop ways to avoid "take" & allow project to move forward
- Designed to protect project proponents & state agencies
- Consult on both state and federally funded/permitted projects in Nebraska
- Common permits needed are 404 permit/401 Water quality certification or NPDES (CSW/ISW)

Nebraska Conservation and Environmental Review Tool

Welcome to the Nebraska Conservation and Environmental Review Tool (CERT) - an interactive tool for conservation planning and NGPC/USFWS environmental review. The CERT provides conservation information on biological diversity, protected lands, and other natural resources for planning purposes and allows users to submit proposed projects for review of potential impacts to threatened, endangered, and special concern species.

Conservation Planning: The CERT allows users to access conservation information without needing to register and login. Users can query data layers and download tables with query information. Users can also make and download maps using the existing data layers or in combination with layers they upload. To use the CERT for conservation planning, click the Map tab above. For information on querying data layers or making maps, click *Resources* under the Help tab.

NGPC/USFWS Environmental Review: To be able to submit proposed projects for environmental review, users are required to register and login. To register, click on <u>Create New Account</u>. After logging in, users will be able to create and submit a project for review. To get started, click the Help tab at the top of the page, select <u>Resources</u>, and read the 'Creating and Submitting a Project for Review' document. The review will evaluate the project's location and activities for potential impacts to state and federally listed threatened and endangered species as well as other at-risk species.


