APPROVAL OF APPLICATION A-19848

WATER DIVISION 2-B

BACKGROUND

- On May 2, 2022, Frank Robbins, on behalf of the Village of Raymond, filed in the Department of Natural Resources (Department) application A-19848 for a temporary permit to appropriate water for the purpose of filling a wastewater lagoon.
- 2. Temporary permits may not be granted for a term of more than one year.

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that application A-19848 is APPROVED subject to the following limitations and conditions:

- 1. The source of water is Oak Creek.
- 2. The water shall be used to fill a wastewater lagoon for the Village of Raymond.
- 3. The priority date is May 2, 2022.
- The point of diversion is located in the NW4SE4 of Section 06, Township 11 North, Range 06 East of the 6th P.M. in Lancaster County as depicted on map number 20995.
- 5. The rate that water may be diverted shall not exceed 2.2 cubic feet per second (1,000 gallons per minute).
- The total amount of water from Oak Creek for diversion under A-19848 shall not exceed 9.6 acre-feet.
- 7. Appropriation A-19848 EXPIRES one year from the date of this Order and will be cancelled without further action by the Department as of that date.
- 8. The appropriator must comply with all relevant statutes. These relevant statutory requirements include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - A. Notify the Department of the name and address of the person responsible for the use of the water appropriation (this may include farm managers, tenants, or relatives that actually apply the water to the approved use).
 - B. Obtain approval from the Department prior to taking any action that changes the location of the point of diversion, the location of the place of use, the type of use, or the type of appropriation.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Failure to comply with all laws and regulations pertaining to surface water appropriations, any orders issued by the Director of the Department of Natural Resources, or the provisions of this Approval may result in the cancellation of the appropriation, temporary closing of the appropriation, administrative penalty, criminal prosecution, or any combination thereof.

This appropriation is not a guarantee that water will be available. Nebraska law gives priority to senior appropriations. This appropriation may be closed if there is insufficient water to satisfy senior appropriations. If in the future you are not able to divert sufficient amounts of water, and if there are junior appropriations upstream, you may call for water by contacting your local field office.
