## APPROVAL OF EXPEDITED TRANSFER EXT-9677 FOR WATER APPROPRIATION A-9017

# AND MAP NUMBER 21000

## WATER DIVISION 2-C

## BACKGROUND

- 1. Records on file in the Department of Natural Resources (Department) show that surface water appropriation A-9017 is held by Jack L. Beguin.
- 2. Appropriation A-9017 has a priority date of December 5, 1956, and authorizes the use of water for irrigation of the 81.3 acres of land described below. The water may be diverted from the Niobrara River at a point of diversion located in the SW4SW4 of Section 28, Township 30 North, Range 44 West of the 6<sup>th</sup> P.M. in Sheridan County. Water diverted shall not exceed the ratio of one cubic foot per second (cfs) for every 70 acres irrigated at a maximum rate of 1.16 cfs.

3. On May 23, 2022, Jack L. Beguin filed application EXT-9677 for a permit for an expedited transfer of the location of use for land authorized to be irrigated by appropriation A-9017 and map number 21000 showing the land proposed to be irrigated under appropriation A-9017 through transfer EXT-9677.

## ORDER

# IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

1. Application EXT-9677 for a permit for an expedited transfer of the location of use and map number 21000 are APPROVED.

2. Appropriation A-9017 through transfer EXT-9677 authorizes the use of water to irrigate 81.3 acres of land described below and depicted on map number 21000, which is made a part of this Order. Water may be diverted from the Niobrara River at a point of diversion located in the SW4SW4 of Section 28, Township 30 North, Range 44 West of the 6th P.M. in Sheridan County, as depicted on map number 21000. Water diverted shall not exceed the ratio of one cfs for every 70 acres irrigated at a maximum rate of 1.16 cfs (521 gallons per minute). The total volume may not exceed 3 acre-feet per irrigated acre per year nor to exceed the least amount of water necessary for the production of crops in the exercise of good husbandry.

- 3. All terms and conditions of appropriation A-9017 remain in effect unless specifically changed by this Order.
- 4. A measuring device, approved by the Department, may be required if so ordered by the Department.
- 5. The appropriator must comply with all relevant statutes. These relevant statutory requirements include, but are not limited to, the following:
  - A. Notify the Department of any change in ownership or address.
  - B. Notify the Department of the name and address of the person responsible for the use of the water appropriation (this may include farm managers, tenants, or relatives that actually apply the water to the approved use).
  - C. Obtain approval from the Department prior to taking any action that changes the location of the point of diversion, the location of the place of use, the type of use, or the type of appropriation.

# ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Failure to comply with all laws and regulations pertaining to surface water appropriations, any orders issued by the Director of the Department of Natural Resources, or the provisions of this Order may cause cancellation of part or all of this appropriation, temporary closing of the appropriation, administrative penalty, criminal prosecution, or any combination thereof.

Nebraska law provides that failure to use a portion or all of a perfected appropriation for more than five consecutive years may result in cancellation of the appropriation.

This appropriation is not a guarantee that water will be available. Nebraska law gives priority to senior appropriations. This appropriation may be closed if there is insufficient water to satisfy senior appropriations.
