# APPROVAL OF EXPEDITED TRANSFER EXT-9758 FOR WATER APPROPRIATION A-627

# AND MAP NUMBER 21100

# WATER DIVISION 2-E

# BACKGROUND

- 1. Records on file in the Department of Natural Resources (Department) show that surface water appropriation A-627 is held by Edward and Robbin Oldaker.
- 2. Appropriation A-627 has a priority date of July 23, 1901, and authorizes the use of water for irrigation of the 35.0 acres of land described below. The water may be diverted from the West Branch of Squaw Creek at a point of diversion located in the NW4NE4 of Section 10, Township 33 North, Range 57 West of the 6th P.M. in Sioux County. Water diverted shall not exceed the ratio of one cubic foot per second (cfs) for every 70 acres irrigated at a maximum rate of 0.50 cfs.

- 3. On January 23, 2023, Melvin Oldaker, on behalf of Edward and Robbin Oldaker, filed application EXT-9758 for a permit for an expedited transfer of the location of use for land authorized to be irrigated by appropriation A-627 and map number 21100 showing the land proposed to be irrigated under appropriation A-627 through transfer EXT-9758.
- 4. On February 6, 2023, Melvin Oldaker corrected filed map number 21100.

#### ORDER

# IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

1. Application EXT-9758 for a permit for an expedited transfer of the location of use and map number 21100 are APPROVED.

2. Appropriation A-627 through transfer EXT-9758 authorizes the use of water to irrigate 35.0 acres of land described below and depicted on map number 21100, which is made a part of this Order. The water may be diverted from the West Branch of Squaw Creek at points of diversion located on the left bank of the stream in the NW4NE4 and SW4NE4 of Section 10, Township 33 North, Range 57 West of the 6th P.M. in Sioux County, as depicted on map number 21100. Water diverted shall not exceed the ratio of one cfs for every 70 acres irrigated at a maximum combined rate of 0.50 cfs from all points of diversion (224 gallons per minute). The total volume may not exceed three acre-feet per irrigated acre per year nor to exceed the least amount of water necessary for the production of crops in the exercise of good husbandry.

- 3. All terms and conditions for appropriation A-627 remain in effect unless specifically changed by this Order.
- 4. A measuring device, approved by the Department, may be required if so ordered by the Department.
- 5. The appropriator must comply with all relevant statutes. These relevant statutory requirements include, but are not limited to, the following:
  - A. Notify the Department of any change in ownership or address.
  - B. Notify the Department of the name and address of the person responsible for the use of the water appropriation (this may include farm managers, tenants, or relatives that actually apply the water to the approved use).
  - C. Obtain approval from the Department prior to taking any action that changes the location of the point of diversion, the location of the place of use, the type of use, or the type of appropriation.

# ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Failure to comply with all laws and regulations pertaining to surface water appropriations, any orders issued by the Director of the Department of Natural Resources, or the provisions of this Order may cause cancellation of part or all of this appropriation, temporary closing of the appropriation, administrative penalty, criminal prosecution, or any combination thereof.

Nebraska law provides that failure to use a portion or all of a perfected appropriation for more than five consecutive years may result in cancellation of the appropriation.

This appropriation is not a guarantee that water will be available. Nebraska law gives priority to senior appropriations. This appropriation may be closed if there is insufficient water to satisfy senior appropriations.
