APPROVAL OF APPLICATION A-20105 AND MAP NUMBER 21665

WATER DIVISION 2-A

BACKGROUND

1. On September 2, 2025, Larry Iverson, on behalf of Allstates Pavement Recycling and Stabilization, filed in the Department of Water, Energy, and Environment (Department) application A-20105 for a temporary Permit to Appropriate Water.
2. Temporary permits may not be granted for a term of more than one year.

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that application A-20105 and map number 21665 are APPROVED subject to the following limitations and conditions:

1. The source of water is the South Loup River.
2. The water shall be used for the purpose of road construction.
3. The priority date is September 2, 2025.
4. The point of diversion is located in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 04, Township 12 North, Range 18 West of the 6th P.M. in Buffalo County.
5. The rate that water may be diverted under appropriation A-20105 shall not exceed 0.67 cubic feet per second (300 gallons per minute). The total amount of water diverted shall not exceed 10 acre-feet.
6. The appropriation EXPIRES one year from the date of this Order and appropriation A-20105 will be CANCELLED without further action by the Department as of that date.
7. The appropriator must comply with all relevant statutes. These relevant statutory requirements include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - A. Notify the Department of any change in ownership or address.
 - B. Notify the Department of the name and address of the person responsible for the use of the water appropriation (this may include farm managers, tenants, or relatives that actually apply the water to the approved use).
 - C. Obtain approval from the Department prior to taking any action that changes the location of the point of diversion, the location of the place of use, the type of use, or the type of appropriation.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Failure to comply with all laws and regulations pertaining to surface water appropriations, any orders issued by the Department, or the provisions of this Order may result in the cancellation of the appropriation, temporary closing of the appropriation, administrative penalty, criminal prosecution, or any combination thereof.

This appropriation is not a guarantee that water will be available. Nebraska law gives priority to senior appropriations. This appropriation may be closed if there is insufficient water to satisfy senior appropriations.
