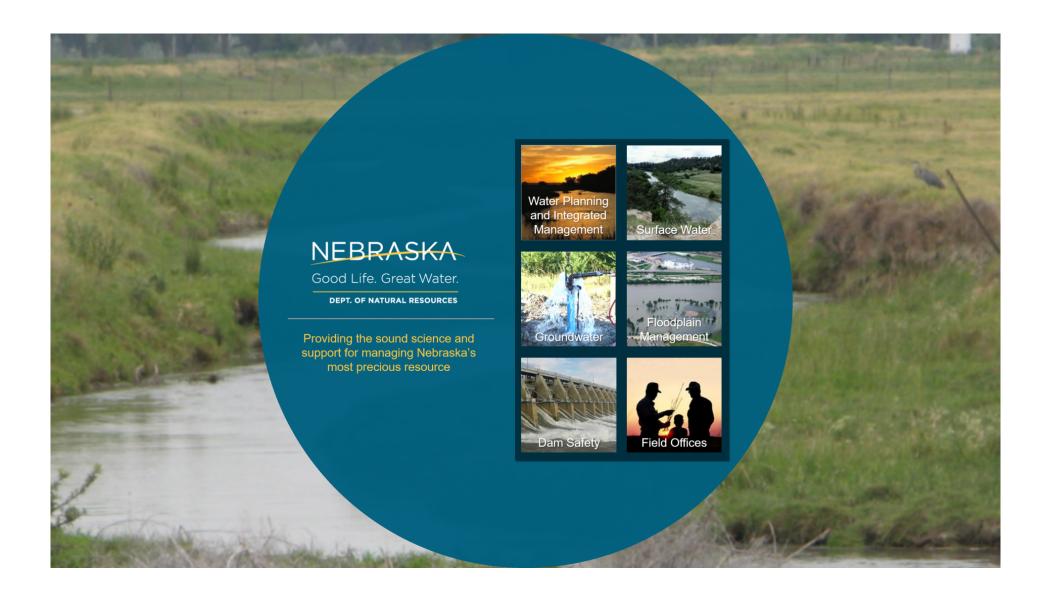

Purpose and Statutes

Requirements found in Neb. Rev. Stat. §§ 46-709 to 46-712

Plan should identify the specific groundwater quantity and quality management items listed in statute

District shall actively solicit public comments and utilize existing data and information

Scheduling a Hearing

Neb. Rev. Stat. § 46-711 (2) describes activities the NRD must do prior to setting the hearing date if the Director of NeDNR disapproves of the submitted plan

Informal Review Option

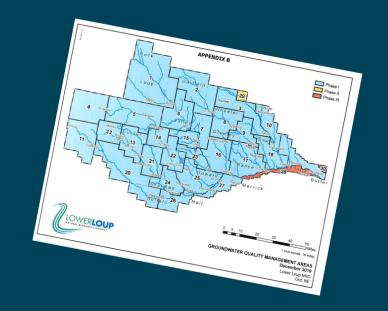
- Districts may request an informal review before beginning the formal review process
- Outcome: agencies provide comments on the draft plan

Ground Water Management Area Designation

Before establishing a Ground Water Management Area:

- The district's Ground Water
 Management Plan shall have been approved by the Director of Natural Resources
- Or the district shall have completed the requirements of § 46-711 (2)

JBJECT: NRD Long-Range Implementation Plan Guidelines

Attached is a copy of the guidelines for the NRD Long-Range Implementation Plans required by L.B. 783. As you are aware L.B. 783 requires the first plans to be submitted by October 1, 1978.

Your first observation of these guidelines will probably be that they are very repetitive and suggest some very detailed information. However, I think you will find no further study that they are not complicated, and, in fact, based on providing some very basic data about each item of information required by the law. Specifically, the guidelines provide for the separation of each district's total program into various programs and pro-jects and the presentation of land rights, mangower and financial needs for each of those programs or projects. The guidelines suggest that not only should the land rights information be displayed by project but also by type oi land rights and the estimated cost of those land rights. Manpower needs are based on the requirements of each program or project and the guidelines include information with regard to the amount of manpower needed as well as the type of personnel. The funding needs presented in the guidelines are designed, for the most part, to tel in with the budget document and includes financial needs by 'program or project as well as data on the type of expenditure by program or project.

Chapter one is a brief introduction. Chapter two includes the suggested categorization of a district's programs and projects. The eighteen included are based on the information contained in the 1976 NRO one and six year plans. It is suggested in this chapter that a brief general description of the program or project be included as well as a narrative describing the current year's needs and the long-range plans and needs. These narratives are very repetitive and are meant only to suggest the types of information that might be included.

Chapters three and four include the tables designed to present the statistical information on land rights, manpower and financial needs for the current budget year and for the next five years respectively.

Chapter five is included as a summary to present any general or summary type information that is deemed necessary or helpful.

In reviewing the guidelines, I hope that you will keep in mind that they were developed to try to include as much diversity as possible and that each district will need to make their own choices on what categories are included so chat the plan best fits your needs. It should also be noted that the information included in these guidelines can be presented in various formats and each NRD should use the type of presentation that best fits their needs and the purposes they want the plan to serve.

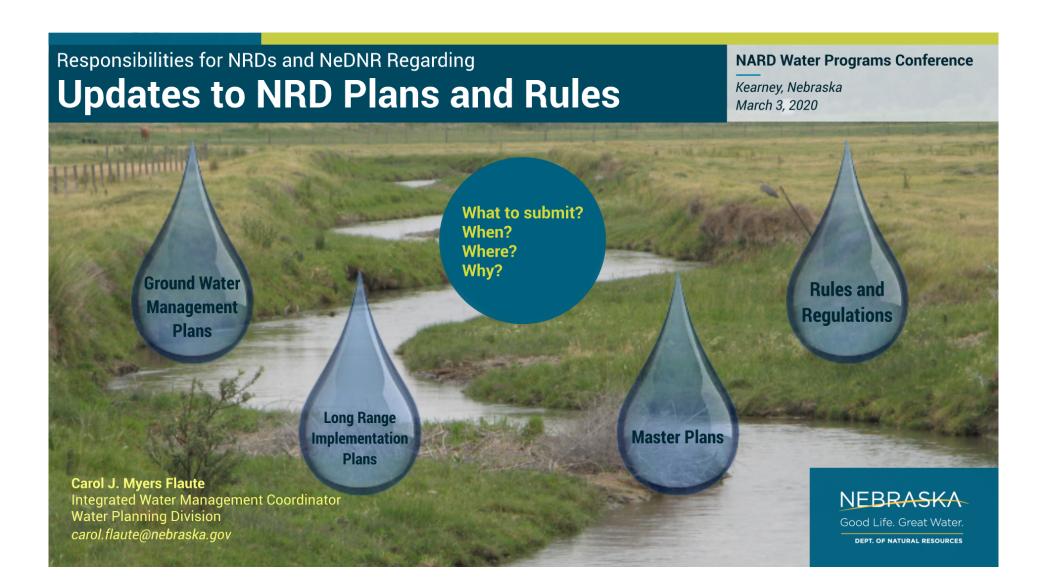

(Neb. Rev. Stat. § 2-3229)

- (1) Erosion prevention and control
- (2) Prevention of damages from flood water and sediment
- (3) Flood prevention and control
- (4) Soil conservation
- (5) Water supply for any beneficial uses
- (6) Development, management, utilization, and conservation of ground water and surface water
- (7) Pollution control
- (8) Solid waste disposal and sanitary drainage
- (9) Drainage improvement and channel rectification
- (10) Development and management of fish and wildlife habitat
- (11) Development and management of recreational and park facilities
- (12) Forestry and range management

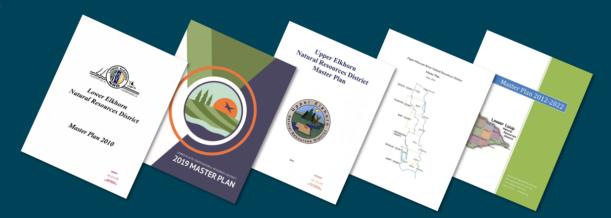
Updates

No hearing required

 Update as often as deemed necessary by the district, but at least every 10 years

Eligibility for State Funds

No state funds shall be allocated or disbursed to a district

- Unless that district has submitted its master plan in accordance with §§ 2-3229 and 2-3276 to 2-3280
- And until the disbursing agency has determined that such funds are for plans, facilities, works, and programs which are in conformance with the plans of the agency.

NRD Rules and Regulations

Purpose



In order to enforce the Nebraska Ground Water Management and Protection Act and to effectuate the policy of the state to conserve ground water resources, a district may adopt and promulgate rules and regulations necessary to discharge the administrative duties assigned in the act

Neb. Rev. Stat. § 46-707 (1)

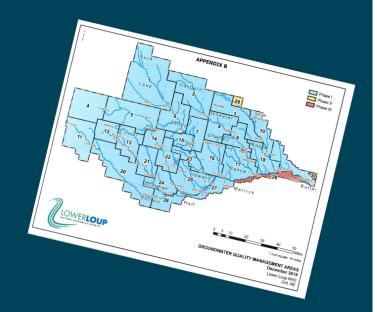
Ground Water Management Area

Purpose

To accomplish any one or more of the following objectives:

- Protection of ground water quantity
- Protection of ground water quality
- Prevention or resolution of conflicts between users of ground water and appropriators of surface water

Neb. Rev. Stat. § 46-712 (1)



Public Hearings are Required

Before any rule or regulation is adopted pursuant to this subsection, a public hearing shall be held within the district.

Neb. Rev. Stat. § 46-707 (1)

In order to establish a management area, the district shall fix a time and place for a public hearing to consider the management plan information supplied by the director and to hear any other evidence.

Neb. Rev. Stat. § 46-712 (2)

NeDNR Testimony Is Required

Any public hearing required under the Nebraska Ground Water Management and Protection Act shall comply with the following requirements:

(7) The hearing shall include testimony of a representative of the Department of Natural Resources. . .

Neb. Rev. Stat. § 46-743

When to Send to NeDNR for Review

The full text of all controls, rules, or regulations shall be made available to the public upon request not later than the date of first publication [of notice of the hearing].

Neb. Rev. Stat. § 46-743 (5)

NeDNR requests these documents for review **no later than** when they are made available to the public in advance of noticing the meeting
