1. Introductions

Introductions were made and the NPDC meeting began at 12:45 p.m. MT on November 7, 2017 at the Goshen County Fairgrounds, Brand Room, Torrington, Wyoming. Patrick T. Tyrrell, the current NPDC chair, conducted the meeting. The sign-in sheet / attendance list from the meeting is *Attachment A*.

2. Review Agenda

A draft proposed agenda was distributed to the NPDC members on October 2, 2017, and a Final Proposed Agenda was distributed on October 25, 2017. The meeting proceeded per the agenda, which is *Attachment B*.

3. Review and Approve April 2017 Minutes – Regular Agenda

The minutes for the April 19, 2017 meeting in Scottsbluff, NE were approved (Nebraska motioned, Reclamation Seconded, the motion carried) and the signature page was circulated to the committee members for signature. The signature page to the April 2017 minutes is *Attachment C*.

4. Water Administration, Operational/Accounting, Allocation Issues, Other

4.1. Wyoming:

Brian Pugsley commented on the relatively good water year even though we received less runoff than predicted. We did not enter into storage water accounts until the 11^{th} of July. Mr. Pugsley listed a few reservoirs and the dates they filled. He then went on to discuss Wyoming's replacement obligations for the 245 Triangle Irrigation Wells. The replacement water came out of the Glendo and Pathfinder accounts (3300 acft out of Glendo and 2915 acft out of Pathfinder). The September 2017 Tributary Replacement is 71 acft and will be replaced with the first release of storage in 2018. Mr. Pugsley then described the other releases of Glendo water. The EA water was moved starting on September 1^{st} and took 22 days. Then from the $22^{nd}-27^{th}$ the Wyoming Water Development account was moved, followed by the CNPPID water on the $27^{th}-29^{th}$. Due to a lack of weather events this year, no adjustments were made to the accounting.

4.2. Reclamation:

Mahonri Williams presented information on their summer operations. All the ownerships filled and the September 2017 carry over amounts were recapped from the morning meeting. The total system storage amount to start Water Year 2018 is 1.9 million acft.

4.3. Nebraska:

Tom Hayden commented on very good fall moisture and above average temperatures that helped bring up soil moisture over a large area. The Laramie River provided good water to the system again this year. The flows at Lewellan have returned to near normal levels due to four good years of moisture. Most canals came on earlier to get storage water at a higher rate than normal.

Jeff Fassett wanted to make the group aware of Mr. Hayden's 55 year service award from the State of Nebraska.

4.4. Colorado:

There was no Colorado representative, but Erin Light provided a report to the group that was read by Jeff Cowley. Precipitation in the North Platte and Laramie River Basins in Colorado was 114% of average. There are presently no calls on water in the basin, however, after a very dry June 660 acft was voluntarily released from Meadow Creek Reservoir to avoid a call on the Michigan River. Irrigated acres in the basin are unknown at this time. The Michigan Ditch exported 5,112 acft (preliminary number) from the North Platte River Basin. The recently installed lysimeter station experienced problems at the beginning of the season, but has since been resolved and should provide good data.

5. Review and Membership of Each Subcommittee—Approval of new committee members and chairpersons.

There were several changes to subcommittee members.

Reclamation's changes are as follows.

Ground Water Wells. Daryl Kohut replaces Lyle Myler Replacement Water. Art Hill replaces Brock Merrill Consumptive Use. Art Hill replaces Lyle Myler Finance. Art Hill replaces Mahonri Williams Official Files. Daryl Kohut replaces Brad Cannon Carlie Ronca asked about the Chair of the Finance Subcommittee. Some discussion took place on whether a senior member would be needed to take over this committee. Pat Tyrrell offered Jeff Cowley to be Chair of the Finance SC.

Nebraska's changes are as follows.

Ground Water Wells. Philip Paitz replaces Colby Osborn Consumptive Use. Melissa Mosier replaces Tim Freed Replacement Water. Melissa Mosier replaces Tim Freed Official Files. Melissa Mosier replaces Tim Freed

A motion was made by Reclamation to accept all changes to committee and subcommittee members. The motion was seconded by Nebraska. The motion carried.

6. Storage water lease from Pathfinder Reservoir Irrigation Account to PRRIP. Concept discussion and status of discussions with affected parties.

Dennis Strauch with Pathfinder Irrigation District discussed how the District would like to lease some of their water in Pathfinder Reservoir to the PRRIP to help the program meet its water goal. There are several hurdles to get over before this can take place including Congressional approval, Wyoming Board of Control approval, and Wyoming Legislative approval. They are seeking input from all parties to make sure every issue is discussed up front. All the Wyoming and Nebraska Contractors have been informed of the idea and all are willing to look into this project further in order to keep the PRRIP moving forward.

Brock Merrill went over the hurdles in more detail. Pointing out that the Congressional approval must happen first. He also went on to describe the uncertainty of the timeline and/or possible success of the bill given the current political climate in Washington DC.

Pat Tyrrell asked about the amount of water being contemplated.

Mr. Strauch told the group they would be looking at adding Environmental use to 16,000 acft. They would not remove the Irrigation use from that amount of water to maintain flexibility. Mr. Tyrrell discussed the process it took to get the Pathfinder Modification approved through the Wyoming process. Between the study, petition, and legislative bills it took about two years.

7. Reports of Standing Subcommittees

7.1. Ground Water Wells SC

Jeff Cowley presented the GWSC report (for George Moser) that stated there were no new groundwater well applications. Lyle Myler presented to the group how this subcommittee would like to only submit a report when they have something that requires NPDC consideration or approval.

Mr. Pugsley pointed out that this would follow what the Control Crest SC already does. Reclamation motioned to adopt the action item of this subcommittee. Nebraska seconded. The motion passed.

Attachment D is the report of the GWSC, which was accepted by the NPDC.

7.2. Control Crest SC

Mr. Pugsley explained that they have not met yet, but will have a report in April 2018. Nebraska motioned to make the CCSC consistant with the previous motion of the GWSC and only submit a report when there is something that requires NPDC consideration or approval. Reclamation seconded. The motion passed.

7.3. Consumptive Use SC

Melissa Mosier presented the CUSC report to the NPDC. The group discussed options for the Irrigation Surveys that have previously been delayed. Approximately 40% of the current survey questions can be answered from alternative data sources. Both Nebraska and Wyoming researched estimated survey costs for around 850 contacts. The CUSC will continue to investigate other sources of data to satisfy the questions posed in past Above Guernsey surveys, and further discuss the possibility of another entity conducting the 2021 survey. There was no action item at this time. *Attachment E* is the report of the CUSC, which was accepted by the NPDC.

7.4. Replacement Water SC

Melissa Mosier presented the RWSC report to the NPDC. This report is the same as the Consumptive Use SC report. The RWSC will continue to investigate other sources of data to satisfy the questions posed in past Triangle Area surveys, and further discuss the possibility of another entity conducting the 2022 survey. There was no action item at this time. *Attachment F* is the report of the RWSC, which was accepted by the NPDC.

7.5. Finance SC

Mahonri Williams presented the FSC report to the NPDC. The main point of the report was the balance for each member being held by the Nebraska Community Foundation (NCF) as of September 30, 2017. He described the extension of the MOA between NCF and NPDC through April 30, 2022. There was no action item at this time. *Attachment G* is the report of the FSC, which was accepted by the NPDC.

7.6. Official Files SC

Melissa Mosier presented the OFSC report to the NPDC. There was no action item at this time. *Attachment H* is the report of the OFSC, which was accepted by the NPDC. One attachment to the report was an updated NPDC Representative and Subcommittee Membership list which will need to be updated by the April 2018 meeting to capture the changes that took place at this meeting.

7.7 Ad Hoc Natural Flow and Ownership SC

Mr. Pugsley told the group that the committee has not met yet and that the group consists of the same members as the Control Crest SC. He also mentioned that this SC should also follow the GWSC and CCSC by only filing a report when NPDC approval is needed. Reclamation motioned to make the NFOSC consistant with the previous motion of the GWSC and CCSC and only submit a report when there is something that requires NPDC consideration or approval. Nebraska seconded.

Discussion took place on accounting for Re Reg water in the system.

Mr. Pugsley described how this September the system accrued Re Reg water (about 23,000 acft) earlier than usual because all the ownerships had their one fill. He wondered if it should be moved to a second fill of ownerships. If Guernsey filled sooner then Glendo could fill sooner.

Mr. Tyrrell mentioned that this would not happen every year and is just an accounting change.

Mr. Williams described how the Natural Flow and Ownership Accounting Procedures provide for the use of Re Reg water, in the spring after ownerships have filled, to top off ownerships from evaporation losses.

Mr. Fassett was supportive of this idea, but thinks it should be guidance only and not a formal rule. He also mentioned that this is a cooperative process and doing this, in the right circumstance, is to the mutual benefit of the water users in the system.

Mr. Fassett and Mr. Tyrrell agreed that this should only be recorded in the minutes and not a formal action/rule.

Ms. Ronca asked about possible injury to anyone.

Mr. Tyrrell mentioned that if this water is moved out of the Re Reg account it is no longer available to be released as natural flow that is used by more than account holders on the river, but the faster ownerships fill, the faster we put water back into Re Reg later on in the year. The group agreed to try this in the 2017-2018 season and revisit after that.

The motion passed.

Brian Pugsley was confirmed as the chair of this subcommittee.

8. Meeting Summary

8.1. Future Agenda Items

As of January 1, 2018 Nebraska will take over as chair of the NPDC for two years. Therefore Mr. Fassett will be chairman for the April 2018 meeting in Scottsbluff. The agenda will be prepared by Melissa Mosier.

Re Reg vs. storage water will be revisited along with Pathfinder Irrigation District—Diversion of natural flow during delivery of Inland Lakes water.

8.2. Schedule Spring 2018 NPDC Meeting and Location

The spring NPDC meeting will be held April 11, 2018 at 1:00 PM in Scottsbluff NE, location TBD . Reclamation's North Platte Water Operations Public Information Meeting will be held at the same location, starting time TBD.

The meeting adjourned at 2:02 PM.

Report of the Consumptive Use Subcommittee

For the November 7, 2017, NPDC Meeting

In accordance with Paragraphs B.II.B & D of Exhibit B to Exhibit 6 of Appendix G of the Final Settlement, a survey of irrigation practices in the Above Guernsey Area is to be conducted every five years to assist, in part, the Consumptive Use Subcommittee (CUSC) with "data collection and analysis and the review of consumptive use calculation methods". The last survey of the Above Guernsey Area was performed in 2011.

At the October 2016 meeting, the NPDC approved a ten, rather than five, year interval between surveys of the Above Guernsey Area and the next survey will be conducted in 2021. At the request of the NPDC, Wyoming provided information at the spring 2017 NPDC meeting on the field data that they are already gathering as part of their Platte River Recovery and Implementation Program (PRRIP) acreage inspection duties.

The CUSC met via conference call on September 29th and October 18th, 2017, to further discuss data collected in Wyoming's acreage inspections, as well as other entities that may be able to conduct the 2021 Above Guernsey Area survey and their associated costs. After review of the data collected by Wyoming during regular acreage inspections, it was determined that this source of data would answer approximately 20% of the questions posed in past surveys. Other sources of data, such as regular reporting conducted by Wyoming to meet NPDC requirements and the NASS Farm and Ranch Irrigation Survey, may provide answers for another 20% of the survey questions, leaving approximately 60% of the questions without reliable sources of data to resolve. The cost estimate that the CUSC received from the Wyoming Survey and Analysis Center (WYSAC) to perform both the Above Guernsey and Triangle Area surveys was \$23,000. The cost estimate that the CUSC received from the University of Nebraska Public Policy Center (PPC) to perform the same work was \$44,900. Both estimates assume a list of approximately 850 contacts generated by Wyoming SEO.

The CUSC will continue to investigate other sources of data to satisfy the questions posed in past Above Guernsey surveys, and further discuss the possibility of another entity, such as WYSAC or the PPC, conducting the 2021 survey.

Report of the Replacement Water Subcommittee

For the November 7, 2017, NPDC Meeting

In accordance with Paragraph D.2 of Exhibit 10, Paragraph B.3.b.ii of Exhibit 11, and Paragraphs B.II.B & D of Exhibit B to Exhibit 6 of Appendix G of the Final Settlement Stipulation, a survey of irrigation practices in the Triangle Area is to be conducted every five years to assist, in part, the Replacement Water Subcommittee (RWSC) in the collection of "information on the basic parameters used to estimate the replacement water requirements". The last survey of the Triangle Area was performed in 2012.

At the October 2016 meeting, the NPDC approved a ten, rather than five, year interval between surveys of the Triangle Area and the next survey will be conducted in 2022. At the request of the NPDC, Wyoming provided information at the spring 2017 NPDC meeting on the field data that they are already gathering as part of their Platte River Recovery and Implementation Program (PRRIP) acreage inspection duties In addition, Wyoming reported a \$13,500 cost estimate provided by the Wyoming Survey and Analysis Center to conduct the next Triangle Area survey.

The RWSC met via conference call on September 29th and October 18th, 2017, to further discuss data collected in Wyoming's acreage inspections, as well as other entities that may be able to conduct the 2022 Triangle Area survey and their associated costs. After review of the data collected by Wyoming during regular acreage inspections, it was determined that this source of data would answer approximately 20% of the questions posed in past surveys. Other sources of data, such as regular reporting conducted by Wyoming to meet NPDC requirements and the NASS Farm and Ranch Irrigation Survey, may provide answers for another 20% of the survey questions, leaving approximately 60% of the questions without reliable sources of data to resolve. The cost estimate that the RWSC received from the Wyoming Survey and Analysis Center (WYSAC) to perform both the Above Guernsey and Triangle Area surveys was \$23,000. The cost estimate that the RWSC received from the University of Nebraska Public Policy Center (PPC) to perform the same work was \$44,900. Both estimates assume a list of approximately 850 contacts generated by Wyoming SEO.

The RWSC will continue to investigate other sources of data to satisfy the questions posed in past Triangle Area surveys, and further discuss the possibility of another entity, such as WYSAC or the PPC, conducting the 2022 survey.

Fall 2017 Budget Status Report

1. Nebraska Community Foundation Financial Statement

The Nebraska Community Foundation (NCF) completed the financial statement report for the quarter ending September 30, 2017. As of September 30, 2017, the NCF reported the following net balances: Nebraska \$8,238.44; Reclamation \$6,177.22; and Wyoming \$1,044.69; with a total balance of \$15,460.35 in the North Platte Decree Foundation Fund.

- 1.1 The Quarterly Financial Statement, for the quarter ending March 31, 2017, from the NCF is attached as Attachment FSC-1.
- 1.2 The Quarterly Financial Statement, for the quarter ending June 30, 2017, from the NCF is attached as Attachment FSC-2.
- 1.3 The Quarterly Financial Statement, for the quarter ending September 30, 2017, from the NCF is attached as Attachment FSC-3.

2. NPDC Contracts / Funding Agreements

- 2.1 Nebraska Community Foundation Memorandum of Agreement
 The NPDC entered into Memorandum of Agreement No. 05AG601965 with the
 NCF to provide financial management support to the NPDC for the Final
 Settlement Stipulation and the Modified North Platte Decree. The original MOA
 was dated June 20, 2005 and had an expiration date of June 20, 2007. The
 first amendment extended the MOA to May 25, 2012. The second amendment
 extended the MOA for another five years to May 25, 2017. The third
 amendment to the MOA was executed in May 2017 and is Attachment FSC-4.
 It extends the agreement to April 30, 2022
- 2.2 <u>Consumptive Use Subcommittee</u> Weather Stations Project: The Wyoming State Engineer's Office has assumed the maintenance of the four weather stations. A multi-year funding agreement for Wyoming to continue operation and maintenance of the weather stations was approved by the NPDC in the April 2016 NPDC meeting.

On March 14, 2017, Wyoming submitted an invoice for the operations, maintenance, and equipment upgrade for the weather stations for the period April 2016 through March 2017. The invoice was approved at the April 2017 NPDC meeting and has since been paid by NCF transferring money to/from the appropriate accounts.

2.3 <u>State of Nebraska</u> – Document and Database Management Services: For a number of years, Nebraska has managed the repository and database for the NPDC official files. More recently, Nebraska contracted with The Flatwater Group for services related to the processing and maintenance of the official files. On April 10, 2017 an invoice was submitted for 2016 costs for activities related to maintenance of the NPDC official files. The invoice was approved at the April 2017 NPDC meeting and has since been paid by NCF transferring money to/from the appropriate accounts.

2.4 The Flatwater Group – Document and Database Management Services:
At the April 2017 the NPDC approved a proposal presented by the Official Files Subcommittee to have the NCF contract with The Flatwater Group (TGF) to provide document and database management Services for the NPDC. The contract was executed on August 17, 2017 and expires on June 30, 2022. The contract specifies that TGF may charge for time and expenses up to \$5,244 per calendar year. There is also provision to adjust the rate annually at a rate not to exceed the lesser of 5% or the average increase in the Engineering News-Record Construction Cost Index based on the average of the 5 calendar years immediately preceding the year in which the proposed increase is to occur.

FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT SUPPORT TO THE NORTH PLATTE DECREE COMMITTEE FOR THE FINAL SETTLEMENT STIPULATION AND THE MODIFIED NORTH PLATTE DECREE

1. Parties. This Amendment Three to Memorandum of Agreement No. 05AG601965 (MOA) is made and entered into by and between the Bureau of Reclamation, hereafter referred to as "Reclamation," the States of Colorado, Nebraska, and Wyoming, hereafter referred to as "States", and the Nebraska Community Foundation, whose address is P.O. Box 83107, Lincoln, NE 68501 for the purpose of extending the term of finance management support to the North Platte Decree Committee and making minor modifications to the MOA.

The parties to the MOU include the parties to the North Platte Decree Committee, hereinafter referred to as the "NPDC", created by the Final Settlement Stipulation and by the Modified North Platte Decree in *Nebraska v. Wyoming*, 122 S. Ct. 420 (2001) by and through its parties' representatives, whose addresses are:

The parties to the NPDC are the States of Nebraska, Wyoming, and Colorado and the United States of America. The parties' representatives on the NPDC are:

- 1. The Wyoming Area Manager of the United States Department of the Interior, Bureau of Reclamation or his or her designee;
- 2. The Director of the Nebraska Department of Natural Resources or his or her designee;
- 3. The Wyoming State Engineer or his or her designee; and
- 4. The Colorado State Engineer or his or her designee.

Here and hereafter collectively referred to as the "NPDC Parties" or referred to individually as "NPDC Party" or "States and Reclamation".

- 2. Purpose of Amendment. This Amendment shall constitute the third amendment to the MOA between the States and Reclamation and the Foundation which was duly executed on June 20, 2005. The original MOA dated June 20, 2005 had an expiration date of June 20, 2007. The first amendment extended the MOA to May 25, 2012. The second amendment extended the MOA to May 25, 2017. The purpose of this third amendment is to extend the term of the MOA and to make minor modifications to the MOA.
- **Term of the Amendment.** The effective date of this amendment is the ending date of the previous amendment (Amendment Two), and shall remain in full force and effect until

April 30, 2022, unless terminated at an earlier date pursuant to the provisions of the MOA, or pursuant to federal or state statute or rule or regulation.

4. **Special Provisions.**

- Insert the following sentence at the beginning of the Article IV.A.5.a. paragraph. "The Foundation shall review proposed contracts in collaboration with the appropriate NPDC subcommittee."
- Delete "an annual maintenance fee of \$300," from the В. Article IV.B.5. second sentence of the paragraph.
- With the exception of items explicitly C. Same Terms and Conditions. delineated in this Amendment, all terms and conditions of the MOA and Amendments One and Two, including but not limited to sovereign immunity, shall remain unchanged and in full force and effect.
- The original Agreement, consisting of nine (9) pages, **Entirety of Agreement.** Amendment One, consisting of four (4) pages, Amendment Two, consisting of four (4) pages, and this Amendment Three, consisting of four (4) pages, represent the entire and integrated agreement between the parties and supersede all prior negotiations, representations, and agreements, whether written or oral.
- IN WITNESS THEREOF, the parties to the MOA through their duly authorized representatives have executed this Amendment Three on the dates set out below, and certify that they have read, understood, and agreed to the terms and conditions of this Amendment Three as set forth herein.

Since the April 2017, NPDC meeting, the Official Files Subcommittee (OFSC) completed a number of tasks that were assigned by the NPDC representatives at the spring meeting, as well as other regularly assigned tasks. The OFSC communicated via email as necessary. The following is a summary of the actions completed by the OFSC since the April 2017 NPDC meeting:

REVIEW OF OFFICIAL FILES (SPRING 2017-FALL 2017)

The OFSC members have reviewed official files sent to the NPDC SharePoint inbox since the April 2017 meeting and have indicated their approval on the approval tracking spreadsheet available on the NPDC SharePoint site.

UPDATES TO THE NPDC REPRESENTATIVE AND SUBCOMMITTE MEMBERSHIP LIST

The NPDC Representative and Subcommittee Membership list (Attachment A) has been updated, reflecting representative and subcommittee membership announcements made since the April 2017 meeting.

PAYMENT FOR 2016 OFSC DOCUMENT AND DATABASE MANAGEMENT

An invoice (#201601) in the amount of \$5,244.00 for services related to document and database management completed for NPDC's official files during the 2016 calendar year was processed by the Nebraska Community Foundation (NCF) and paid in full by the NPDC parties.

PROPOSAL FOR DIRECT CONTRACT BETWEEN NPDC AND THE FLATWATER GROUP FOR DOCUMENT AND DATABASE MANAGEMENT SERVICES

At the April 2017 meeting, the OFSC proposed and the NPDC approved a change to the procedure used to contract for document and database management services of the NPDC official files. The Flatwater Group (TFG) now provides document and database management services directly to the NPDC, with the Nebraska Community Foundation (NCF) serving as the contracting agent. A contract between NPDC and TFG, with NCF acting as contracting agent, for document and database management services was fully signed on August 17, 2017, and is set to expire on June 30, 2022. The contract specifies that the maximum amount payable to TFG for time and expenses is \$5,244 per calendar year. This maximum compensation rate and labor rates set forth in the contract may be adjusted annually at a rate not to exceed the lesser of 5% or the average increase in the Engineering News-Record Construction Cost Index based on the average of the 5 calendar years immediately preceding the year in which the proposed increase is to occur.
