Caitlin Kingsley (NeDNR) presented formatting improvements that had been made to both budgets. The addition to the current fiscal year budget (Attachment 6Ai) is a new request by TPNRD to add additional recharge sites along the Keith-Lincoln Canal.

ii. Studies (Attachment 6Aii)

Caitlin reviewed the new Studies invoices highlighted in yellow on Attachment 6Aii: an invoice from TFG for the Robust Review expanded methods documentation (contract #1525) and an invoice from ARI for parcel-based modeling (contract #1524). NeDNR will be paying the contract #1524 invoice in full, but the invoices must still be approved by PBC as #1524 is a PBC contract. The entire Studies sheet has been updated to reflect when each invoice was approved by PBC and distributed to the relevant parties for payment.

Caitlin reported that this year's excess flow variances are being submitted through the Decision Support System (DSS). Scott Schaneman (NPNRD) indicated that while the process of uploading to DSS had some initial minor issues, the most significant challenge is the need to obtain annual sign-off from all irrigation districts. Scott suggested exploring longer-term agreements. Brandi Flyr (CPNRD) noted recurring difficulties in completing the variance forms. Ryan Kelly (NeDNR) offered to meet with CPNRD to address and resolve the issues with the variance forms.

Kent shared that the Meadowlark Project fertilizer plant in Gothenburg is seeking green energy and proposed studying a 7,000-acre solar panel development to the NCORPE Board. Previously the NCORPE Board was against the development of wind projects but has reconsidered its stance for potential solar projects. Ryan asked if the energy would remain within the Nebraska power grid, and Kent affirmed that it would.

E. NPNRD

Scott updated the group about a renewable energy project being considered in Scotts Bluff County; the permit was denied once but has been revised and is open for discussion. The project would cover 3,500 acres. There is another project of similar size being considered in Banner County currently. Kent added that the County has the final say and can stop the projects through zoning.
