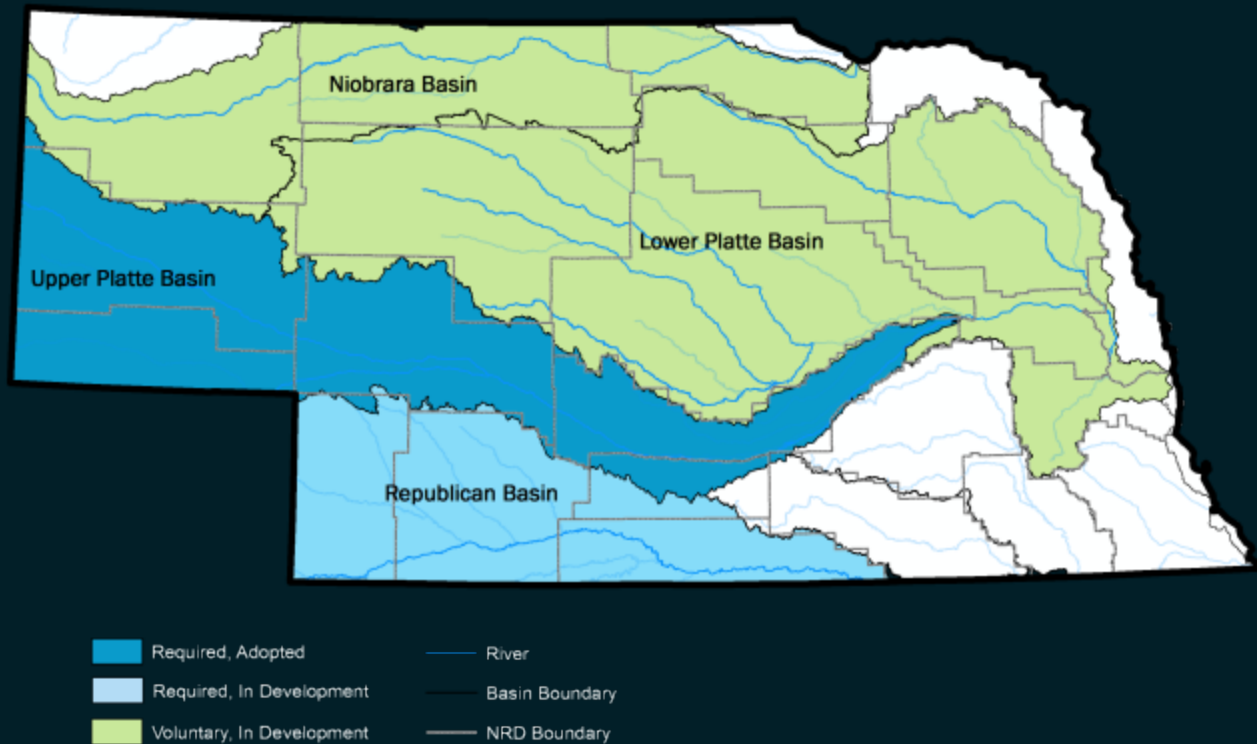

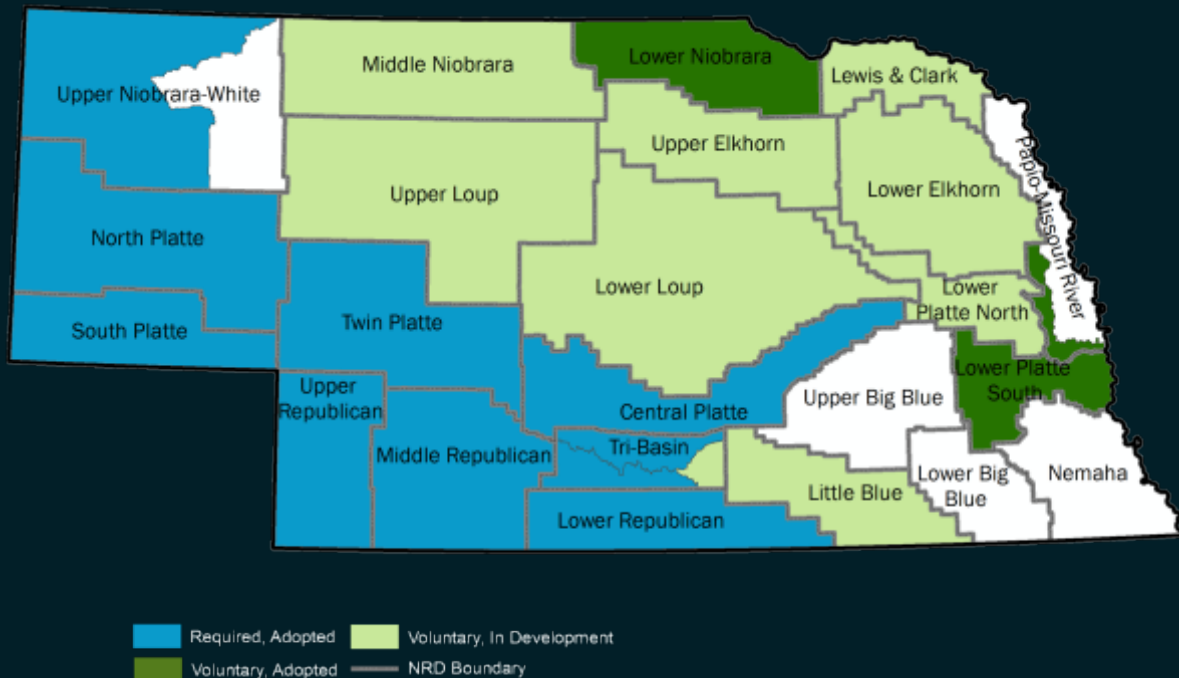

Basin-Wide Plans (BWPs)



- Provides a general framework for consistency between the goals and objectives of individual IMPs
- Ability to establish more collaborative framework for implementation of individual IMPs

Integrated Management Plans (IMPs)



- Adaptive management strategies to address opportunities and challenges pertaining to water resources
- NRDs and DNR jointly develop, adopt, and implement IMPs in conjunction with stakeholder input

Upper Platte

- Preparing for updating the basin-wide plan and individual IMPs
- Implementing a variety of projects throughout the basin
- Conducting analyses of the progress on first increment goals and objectives

Lower Platte

- Voluntary basin-wide plan and IMPs
- Evaluating water banking options and limitations on future development
- Various evaluations of storage opportunities, conjunctive management, and recharge options

Republican

- Three-state discussions
- Basin-wide planning
- Adoption of fourth generation IMPs
- Completion of WaterSMART study

Niobrara

- Voluntary basin-wide plan and IMPs
- Spencer hydropower transfer, legislative proposals
- Completion of WaterSMART study

Statewide

- Water Sustainability Fund
- New rules for fully appropriated basin assessments
- Continued improvements in water use data collection and information availability

 - INSIGHT
 - Interactive maps
 - IDEP
