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- 1. Welcome and Open Meetings Act:** Miller noted that a copy of the Open Meetings Act was available in the meeting room.
- 2. Publication of Meeting Notices:** The NDNR published a public notice (Attachment B) of the PBC meeting in the Grand Island Independent on July 28, 2015, the North Platte Telegraph on August 1, 2015, and the Scottsbluff Star Herald on July 28, 2015.
- 3. Agenda Modifications:** No revisions were made to the agenda (Attachment C).
- 4. Approval of June 18th, 2015, PBC Meeting Minutes:**

Motion: To approve the June 18th, 2015, PBC meeting minutes (Attachments D).
Berge motioned to approve and Horn seconded. Motion passed with all ayes.
- 5. Budget Update (NDNR)**
 - A. Operations:** Sharp led the group in a discussion of the PBC budget summary spreadsheets (Attachment E). Sharp reported that the operations budget has had no changes since the previous meeting.
 - B. Studies:** Sharp reported the studies budget was updated for the conservation study invoice, but needs to be re-calculated to reflect the 60/40 split between NDNR and the NRDs. This will be corrected by the next meeting. The NPNRD

lease/recharge and Grandview projects were updated and contracts are being drawn. There are no further invoices on the Phase II North Dry Creek project and the remaining budget needs re-allocated.

i. Conservation Measures Study

- a. Invoice:** The final amount of the invoice (Attachment F) needs to be approved and then NDNR will send the invoices to the NRDs.

Motion: To approve the Flatwater Invoice on Contract #571 in the amount of \$17,834.50.

**Berge motioned to approve and Horn seconded.
Motion passed with all ayes.**

Action: Sharp will correct the study budget to reflect a 60/40 split on the Conservation Study Phase II. Sharp will send the invoices to the NRDs in the next week.

- ii. Difference Between Current and Fully Appropriated Study:** No update

- iii. Robust Review:** No update

- C. Second three-year increment funding (years 4-6):** Sharp reported that updates were made to the years 4-6 budget based on the NPNRD retirement agreement and the E65/Elwood request for additional funds (Attachment G). There were more excess flows available in the Platte than expected, resulting in an amended contract and increased project cost. An additional \$85,280, split evenly between NDNR and TBNRD, were requested for approval.

Motion: To approve an additional \$85,280, split evenly between NDNR and TBNRD, for the E65/Elwood Contract #800.

**Woodward motioned to approve and Schellpeper seconded.
Motion passed with all ayes.**

6. Project Updates

- A. N-CORPE:** Miller reported that the current estimated timeline for construction of the north pipeline is 2016. Depending on the likely forecast released by NDNR in November, there are no current plans to pump water to the south.

- B. Orchard Alfalfa:** Woodward reported construction is done. The snagging and clearing was done in the spring, and some rehabilitation was also completed on a few turnouts. Applications for transferring water back to the river will be submitted to NDNR.

C. J-2 Regulating Reservoir: Schellpeper asked guest Kevin Boyd if he had any input. He reported that the CNPPID board held a special meeting a month ago at which a motion to approve the use of condemnation for the project did not pass, but this could come up for a vote again in the future. CNPPID staff continue to negotiate with landowners. The estimated cost of the project has increased significantly.

D. North Platte NRD Lease: Berge reported that work on permits with NDNR continues.

E. Tri-Basin Phase II Augmentation: Thorburn reported the augmentation wells ran for 10 days in early May.

F. South Platte NRD Temporary Retirement Agreement: Horn reported that water use at the project site continues to be monitored.

G. North Platte NRD Retirement Agreement: NDNR is still in the process of putting the contract together for NPNRD's retirement reimbursement proposal #1 from the June 18, 2015 meeting. Proposal #1 includes total funding for the project, rather than payments made to date, and reimbursements for payments will be made through a sub-account with the Nebraska Community Foundation. Once the contract for proposal #1 is completed, a vote will need to be taken to approve the changed funding amount.

Action: NDNR staff will work with NPNRD in putting together the contract for the groundwater retirement project.

7. Public Comments: There were no public comments.

8. Adjourn: Miller reminded everyone to bring their calendars to the October meeting so that the meetings for 2016 could be scheduled. The meeting adjourned at 2:49 p.m.

- 1. Welcome and Open Meetings Act:** Miller noted that a copy of the Open Meetings Act was available in the meeting room.
- 2. Publication of Meeting Notices:** The NDNR published a public notice (Attachment B) of the PBC meeting in the Grand Island Independent on June 11, 2015, the North Platte Telegraph on June 11, 2015, and the Scottsbluff Star Herald on June 9, 2015.
- 3. Agenda Modifications:** No revisions were made to the agenda (Attachment C).
- 4. Approval of April 13th, 2015, PBC Meeting Minutes:**

Motion: To approve the April 13th, 2015, PBC meeting minutes (Attachments D).
Schellpeper motioned to approve and Horn seconded. Motion passed with all ayes.
- 5. Budget Update (NDNR)**
 - A. Operations:** Sharp led the group in a discussion of the PBC budget summary spreadsheets (Attachment E). Sharp reported that the operations budget has had no changes since the previous meeting.

- B. Studies:** Sharp reported that contract numbers were added to the contracts per request of the PBC. The contracts are also being merged into one file so they can be reviewed more efficiently.

Action: Sharp will work on merging the PBC contract files.

- C. Second three-year increment funding:** NDNR did revise Exhibit 1 of the amendment to the Platte Basin Water Project Coalition interlocal cooperative agreement to include the dollar amount of the Phase I Conservation Study to the studies budget. Payments were made on North Dry Creek in the amount of \$3,000 leaving a balance of \$17,160. Sharp noted that to close-out the North Dry Creek budget we need to know if more invoices are expected or if all invoices have been received. Orchard Alfalfa spent their funding in years 1-3 on the recent October through March payment request. In years 4-6, Sharp confirmed with Mark Czaplewski of CPNRD that Orchard Alfalfa has \$20,722.74 remaining to spend on their project.

Proposals for funding for four spring and summer of 2015 excess flow groundwater recharge projects were proposed to the PBC members. Schellpeper referred to the project proposal memos handed out to the members (Attachments F and G). The total new cost for the recharge projects involving the Platte Valley, Western, and Suburban Irrigation Districts is \$25,000. This proposal would require discussion on how NET funds may be reallocated due to TPNRD funds for years 4-6 already being budgeted for. The acre-foot cap for the Elwood Reservoir and E-65 Canal recharge project was increased from 10,000 to 15,000 for the spring/summer 2015 excess flows, resulting in a request for an additional \$213,200 in funding.

Motion: To approve the funding request from TPNRD, SPNRD, and NDNR for Suburban, Western, and Platte Valley recharge projects. Funding for TPNRD's portion of these projects is approved on the condition that there are NET funds available at the end of years 4, 5, and 6. Total project cost of \$25,000 with Suburban Irrigation District Project \$2,000 by TPNRD, \$3,000 by NDNR; Western Irrigation District Project \$4,200 by TPNRD, \$1,800 by SPNRD, \$9,000 by NDNR; Platte Valley Irrigation District \$2,000 by TPNRD, \$3,000 by NDNR.

Woodward motioned to approve and Horn seconded. The motion passed with all eyes.

Motion: To approve the funding request from TBNRD and NDNR for the spring/summer 2015 Elwood Reservoir and E-65 Canal recharge projects. Total project costs of \$213,200 with \$106,600 by TBNRD, and \$106,600 by NDNR.

Reynolds motioned to approve and Woodward seconded. The motion passed with all ayes.

6. Project Updates

- A. N-CORPE:** Miller reported that the current estimated timeline for construction of the north pipeline is 2016. State-revolving funds are being sought, but legislative action is required to change statute and allow use of these funds. New language is expected to be introduced in the next legislative session. Easements are completed for the six miles of county road and work on the easements with landowners on approximately four miles should wrap up in about six weeks.
- B. Orchard Alfalfa:** Woodward reported that in May they did divert water due to excess flows, and also filed transfer water rights on approximately 3,000 of the 4,000 acres that are to be transferred back to the river.
- C. J-2 Regulating Reservoir:** Schellpeper referred attendees to the quarterly update in the meeting packet (Attachment H). Issues were identified in that the anticipated costs are likely to increase and they plan to deliver an updated opinion of the costs sometime this year. Schneider offered that the increase is primarily due to the changing construction bidding climate in that more companies were looking for work when the initial cost estimate was made. It was asked if the project costs could be capped. Schneider stated monetary commitment could be reduced but that would also reduce the percentage of benefits through PRRIP that the State would receive.
- D. North Platte NRD Lease:** At the preceding Upper Platte Basin-Wide IMP Annual Meeting, Berge reported on the Cow Camp project for which the NPNRD leased approximately 350 acres of farmland and how the historic irrigated crop water use of those acres was calculated so as to be credited toward NPNRD's obligations (Attachment I). The next steps in the project are to finalize documentation of the project and submit an amended recharge permit application to NDNR.
- E. Tri-Basin Phase II Augmentation:** At the preceding Upper Platte Basin-Wide IMP Annual Meeting, Little reported that the second augmentation well was put in place (Attachment J). The second well was run for a few days this spring in order to test it.

F. South Platte NRD Temporary Retirement Agreement: Glanz reported that SPNRD is monitoring water use at the temporary retirement location.

7. Project Requests:

A. North Platte NRD Retirement Agreement: Berge referred to the retirement project funding proposal memo in the meeting packet (Attachment K). These are groundwater retirement projects that NPNRD is seeking reimbursement for. Miller mentioned that it is important to ensure that this proposed reimbursement is legal and that the legislature would view it as money spent. Berge stated he didn't need action on Proposal #1 today and the group agreed to consider Proposal #2 for action while waiting on a determination on Proposal #1 from the NDNR staff.

Motion: To approve Proposal #2 as outlined in the NPNRD memo (\$75,815.25 x 3), while waiting for NDNR staff to address Proposal #1.

Mintken motioned to approve and Horn seconded. The motion passed with all ayes.

Action: NDNR staff will look into Proposal #1 of NPNRD's Groundwater Retirement Package and report back to the group at the August 6, 2015, PBC meeting.

8. Public Comments: There were no public comments.

9. Adjourn: The meeting adjourned at 3:04 p.m.

TBNRD, NDNR, and CNPPID amended Contract #800 (attached) on May 12, 2015, for the diversion of excess Platte River flows for the purpose of groundwater recharge. Up to 2,000 of additional acre feet of water are contracted for diversion into the Elwood or E65 Canal reservoir. On May 22, 2015, for Elwood and E65 Canal an amendment for up to additional 3,000 acre feet of water is contracted for diversion. Totals are to be split evenly between the TBNRD and NDNR, totaling \$213,200 or \$106,600 for each party.

Request New Funds:

TBNRD, NDNR, and CNPPID amended Contract #800 (attached) on June 26, 2015, for the diversion of excess Platte River flows for the purpose of groundwater recharge. Up to 2,000 of additional acre feet of water are contracted for diversion into the Elwood or E65 Canal reservoir. Totals are to be split evenly between the TBNRD and NDNR, totaling \$85,280 or \$42,640 for each party.

PBC:

The previous total cost for the E65 Canal and Elwood Reservoir projects totaling \$213,000 or \$106,000 for TBNRD & \$106,600 for NDNR NET funds. The new cost for the E65 Canal and Elwood Reservoir projects detailed in the amendment to contract #800 and being submitted to the PBC for total payment is \$85,280 or \$46,640 for TBNRD & \$46,640 for NDNR NET funds. The overall total cost for the project is \$298,480 or \$149,240 for TBNRD & \$149,240 for NDNR NET funds.

THIS AMENDMENT NO. 2 made and entered into this 12th day of May, 2015, by and between The Central Nebraska Public Power and Irrigation District, a public corporation and political subdivision of the State of Nebraska, with its principal office located at 415 Lincoln Street, P.O. Box 740, Holdrege, NE 68949-0740, hereinafter referred to as "Central" and Tri-Basin Natural Resources District, a political subdivision of the State of Nebraska, with its principal office located at 1723 North Burlington Street, Holdrege, NE 68949, hereinafter referred to as "Tri-Basin", and the State of Nebraska, acting by and through the Nebraska Department of Natural Resources, with its principal office located at 301 Centennial Mall South, Lincoln, NE 68509-4676, hereinafter referred to as "State". Sometimes hereinafter Central, State and Tri-Basin shall be collectively referred to as "Parties" or individually as "Party".

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Parties entered into a Water Service Agreement for Groundwater Recharge from Excess Flows using the E65 Canal and the Elwood Reservoir dated December 10, 2014, hereinafter the Original Agreement; and

WHEREAS, on December 18, 2014 the Parties entered into Amendment No. 1 to the Water Service Agreement for Groundwater Recharge from Excess Flows which amended the terms and provisions of the Original Agreement by increasing the Total Amount Diverted limit from 5,000 acre feet to 10,000 acre feet;

WHEREAS, the Parties mutually desire to amend the terms and provisions of the Agreement by increasing the Total Amount Diverted limit from 10,000 acre feet to 12,000 acre feet, whereby initial targets for the increased diversions are 1,800 acre feet into Elwood Reservoir and 200 acre feet into the E65 Canal;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promise and agreements herein contained, and other good and valuable consideration, the Parties do hereby covenant and agree that said Original Agreement be and the same hereby is amended as follows:

1. Section 1(a) of the Original Agreement is hereby amended to read as follows:

During the term of this Agreement, Central will provide the State and Tri-Basin with groundwater recharge via seepage along and adjacent to the E65 Canal and Elwood Reservoir for the purposes described above equal to the Total Amount Diverted, as hereinafter defined, up to a maximum total of 12,000 acre feet of water in the non-irrigation season. Subsequent to the Amendment No. 1 of this Agreement, additional targets of 1,800 acre feet into Elwood Reservoir and 200 acre feet in the E65 Canal may be adjusted with agreement among the Parties. The Total Amount Diverted shall be measured by Central using the E65 Canal measuring flume located at milepost (MP) 2.8 (including water diverted and not available for recharge because of evaporation). The portion of the Total Amount Diverted that is delivered to Elwood Reservoir will be estimated using pump performance curves developed by Central, with all remaining diversions passing the MP 2.8 flume considered diversions for the E65

Canal. The Total Amount Diverted will be adjusted, as appropriate, by subtracting any deliveries or releases made by Central from the E65 Canal, at the end of each subsequent quarter or billing period, and at the beginning of the next irrigation season. The non-irrigation season will begin when Central stops releasing water into sections of the E65 Canal for irrigation and end when Central begins releasing water into sections of the E65 Canal for irrigation, as determined by Central.

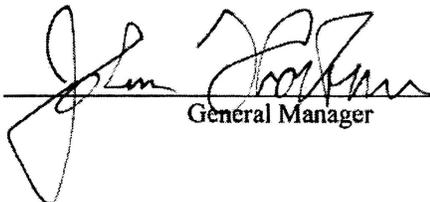

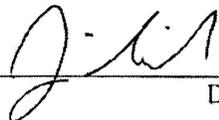

THIS AMENDMENT NO. 3 made and entered into this 22nd day of May, 2015, by and between The Central Nebraska Public Power and Irrigation District, a public corporation and political subdivision of the State of Nebraska, with its principal office located at 415 Lincoln Street, P.O. Box 740, Holdrege, NE 68949-0740, hereinafter referred to as "Central" and Tri-Basin Natural Resources District, a political subdivision of the State of Nebraska, with its principal office located at 1723 North Burlington Street, Holdrege, NE 68949, hereinafter referred to as "Tri-Basin", and the State of Nebraska, acting by and through the Nebraska Department of Natural Resources, with its principal office located at 301 Centennial Mall South, Lincoln, NE 68509-4676, hereinafter referred to as "State". Sometimes hereinafter Central, State and Tri-Basin shall be collectively referred to as "Parties" or individually as "Party".

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Parties entered into a Water Service Agreement for Groundwater Recharge from Excess Flows using the E65 Canal and the Elwood Reservoir dated December 10, 2014, hereinafter the Original Agreement; and

WHEREAS, on December 18, 2014 the Parties entered into Amendment No. 1 to the Water Service Agreement for Groundwater Recharge from Excess Flows which amended the terms and provisions of the Original Agreement by increasing the Total Amount Diverted limit from 5,000 acre feet to 10,000 acre feet;

WHEREAS, on May 12, 2015 the Parties entered into Amendment No. 2 to the Water Service Agreement for Groundwater Recharge from Excess Flows which amended the terms and provisions of the Original Agreement by increasing the Total Amount Diverted from 10,000 acre feet to 12,000 acre feet;

WHEREAS, the Parties mutually desire to amend the terms and provisions of the Agreement by increasing the Total Amount Diverted limit from 12,000 acre feet to 15,000 acre feet;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promise and agreements herein contained, and other good and valuable consideration, the Parties do hereby covenant and agree that said Original Agreement be and the same hereby is amended as follows:

1. Section 1(a) of the Original Agreement is hereby amended to read as follows:

During the term of this Agreement, Central will provide the State and Tri-Basin with groundwater recharge via seepage in Elwood Reservoir for the purposes described above equal to the Total Amount Diverted, as hereinafter defined, up to a maximum total of 15,000 acre feet of water in the non-irrigation season. In addition, recharge will continue under Amendment No. 2 adjacent to the E-65 Canal to complete the 200 acre foot goal. Central has a separate agreement with the Nebraska Community Foundation and the Platte River Recovery Implementation Program for recharge from Elwood Reservoir. The State and Tri-Basin agree to share the Total Amount Diverted with the Nebraska Community Foundation and the Platte River Recovery Implementation Program, with the State/Tri-Basin's share equal to 50% and

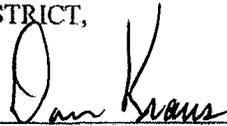
the Foundation/Platte Program's share equal to 50% The Total Amount Diverted shall be calculated by Central using the pump performance curves for pumps at Elwood Reservoir, diversions at the measuring flume located at milepost (MP) 2.8 (including water diverted and not available for recharge because of evaporation), and water continuing into the E65 Canal.

2. In the event any terms and provisions of this Amendment are construed to conflict with the terms and provisions of the Original Agreement, the terms and provisions of this Amendment shall prevail. In all other respect, except as herein amended, the terms and provisions of the Original Agreement shall remain in full force and effect. This Amendment shall have the same force and effect as if incorporated in the Original Agreement, and shall take precedence thereover.

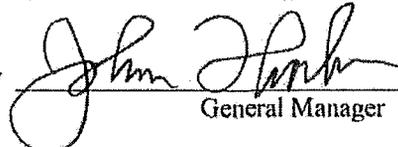

THIS AMENDMENT NO. 4 made and entered into this 26 day of June, 2015, by and between The Central Nebraska Public Power and Irrigation District, a public corporation and political subdivision of the State of Nebraska, with its principal office located at 415 Lincoln Street, P.O. Box 740, Holdrege, NE 68949-0740, hereinafter referred to as "Central" and Tri-Basin Natural Resources District, a political subdivision of the State of Nebraska, with its principal office located at 1723 North Burlington Street, Holdrege, NE 68949, hereinafter referred to as "Tri-Basin", and the State of Nebraska, acting by and through the Nebraska Department of Natural Resources, with its principal office located at 301 Centennial Mall South, Lincoln, NE 68509-4676, hereinafter referred to as "State". Sometimes hereinafter Central, State and Tri-Basin shall be collectively referred to as "Parties" or individually as "Party".

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Parties entered into a Water Service Agreement for Groundwater Recharge from Excess Flows using the E65 Canal and the Elwood Reservoir dated December 10, 2014, hereinafter the Original Agreement; and

WHEREAS, on December 18, 2014 the Parties entered into Amendment No. 1 to the Water Service Agreement for Groundwater Recharge from Excess Flows which amended the terms and provisions of the Original Agreement by increasing the Total Amount Diverted limit from 5,000 acre feet to 10,000 acre feet;

WHEREAS, on May 12, 2015 the Parties entered into Amendment No. 2 to the Water Service Agreement for Groundwater Recharge from Excess Flows which amended the terms and provisions of the Original Agreement by increasing the Total Amount Diverted from 10,000 acre feet to 12,000 acre feet;

WHEREAS, on May 22, 2015 the Parties entered into Amendment No. 3 to the Water Service Agreement for Groundwater Recharge from Excess Flows which amended the terms and provisions of the Original Agreement by increasing the Total Amount Diverted from 12,000 acre feet to 15,000 acre feet; and it also stated the State and Tri-Basin would share the Total Amount Diverted with the Nebraska Community Foundation and the Platte River Recovery Implementation Program on an equal basis.

WHEREAS, the Parties mutually desire to amend the terms and provisions of the Agreement by increasing the Total Amount Diverted limit from 15,000 acre feet to 17,000 acre feet;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promise and agreements herein contained, and other good and valuable consideration, the Parties do hereby covenant and agree that said Original Agreement be and the same hereby is amended as follows:

1. Section 1(a) of the Original Agreement is hereby amended to read as follows:

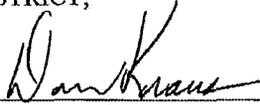
During the term of this Agreement, Central will provide the State and Tri-Basin with groundwater recharge via seepage in Elwood Reservoir for the purposes described above equal to the Total Amount Diverted, as hereinafter defined, up to a maximum total of 17,000 acre feet

of water in the non-irrigation season. Central has a separate agreement with the Nebraska Community Foundation and the Platte River Recovery Implementation Program for recharge from Elwood Reservoir. The State and Tri-Basin agree to share the Total Amount Diverted with the Nebraska Community Foundation and the Platte River Recovery Implementation Program, with the State/Tri-Basin's share equal to 50% and the Foundation/Platte Program's share equal to 50% The Total Amount Diverted shall be calculated by Central using the pump performance curves and annubar readings at Elwood Reservoir, diversions at the measuring flume located at milepost (MP) 2.8 (including water diverted and not available for recharge because of evaporation), and water continuing into the E65 Canal.

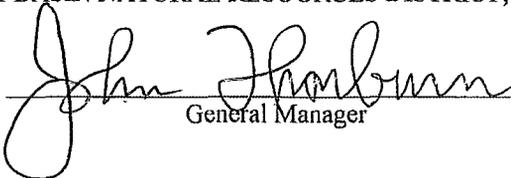

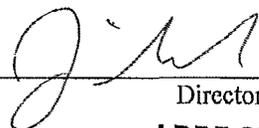

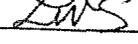
